

Of the 147 new books bought this year for the school library 100% were Non-Fiction.


Two Professional Development Days were held at the Heath Brook School on Non Fiction Reading & Writing through the Keys To Literacy Program.


Teachers used 'Top Down Webs' and 'Two Column Notes' to improve students' ability to write informational text.

## STATUS ON SCHOOL GOALS


- School Council met from November to May to develop a parent survey. We are still working on this survey and hope to have it ready in the fall.

Trained 47 volunteers and the entire staff to implement the Destiny Computer Program for book distribution.


100% of the 147 new books in our library are Non-fiction.

New rugs and chairs have been installed in the library.













#### Kindergarten Phoneme Segmentation Fluency End of the Year Percentages








#### First Grade Oral Reading Fluency End of Year Percentages




#### Second Grade Oral Reading Fluency End of Year Percentage





#### HEATH BROOK SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT GOALS 2014-2015

### Student Goal

Design and develop a new RTI program. Progress Monitor all struggling students every six weeks.

By June 2015 100% of all RTI students will increase their reading level by at least one grade

level.

# School/Instructional Improvement Goal

Institute monthly grade level meetings to share best practices, collect data and improve instruction in reading, writing and math.



# Professional Improvement Goal

Increase the time spent on classroom observation and walk throughs.

At least two hours per week will be set aside for principal/classroom visits. This will be monitored through the principal's calendar and Teach Point

data.
