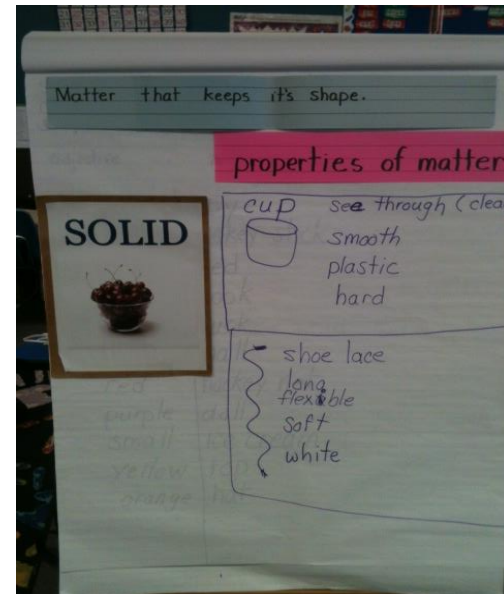

Student Learning Goal

Increase non fiction and informational reading and writing in grades K, 1, 2.



STATUS ON STUDENT LEARNING GOAL

Of the 147 new books bought this year for the school library 100% were Non-Fiction.

Two Professional Development Days were held at the Heath Brook School on Non Fiction Reading & Writing through the Keys To Literacy Program.

Teachers used 'Top Down Webs' and 'Two Column Notes' to improve students' ability to write informational text.

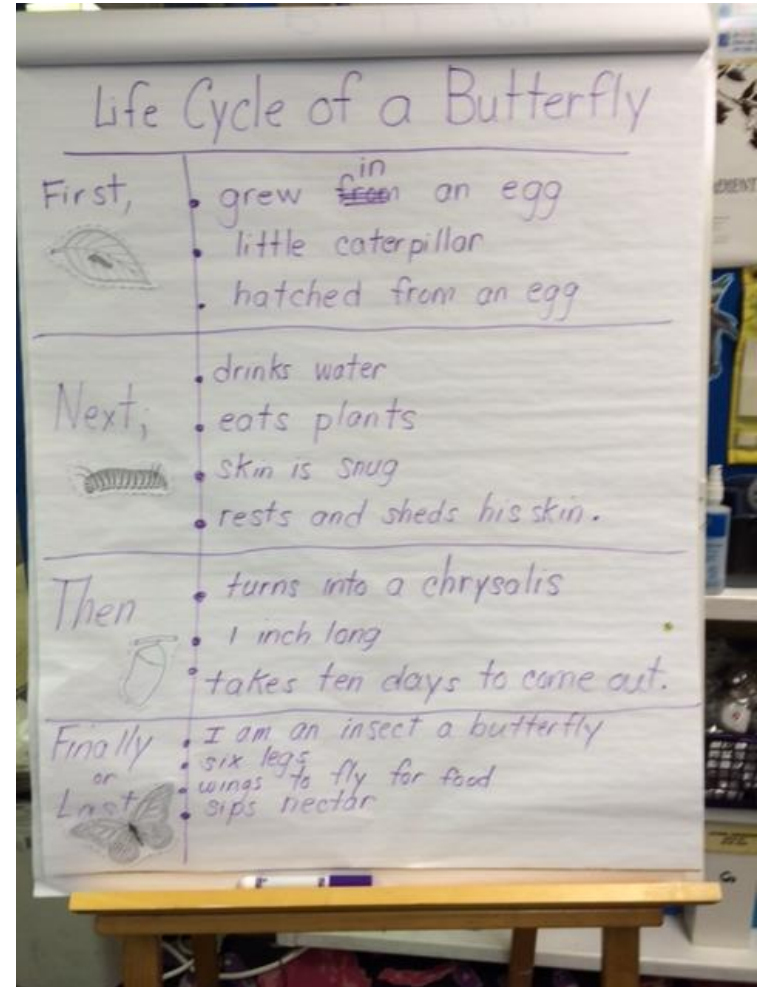
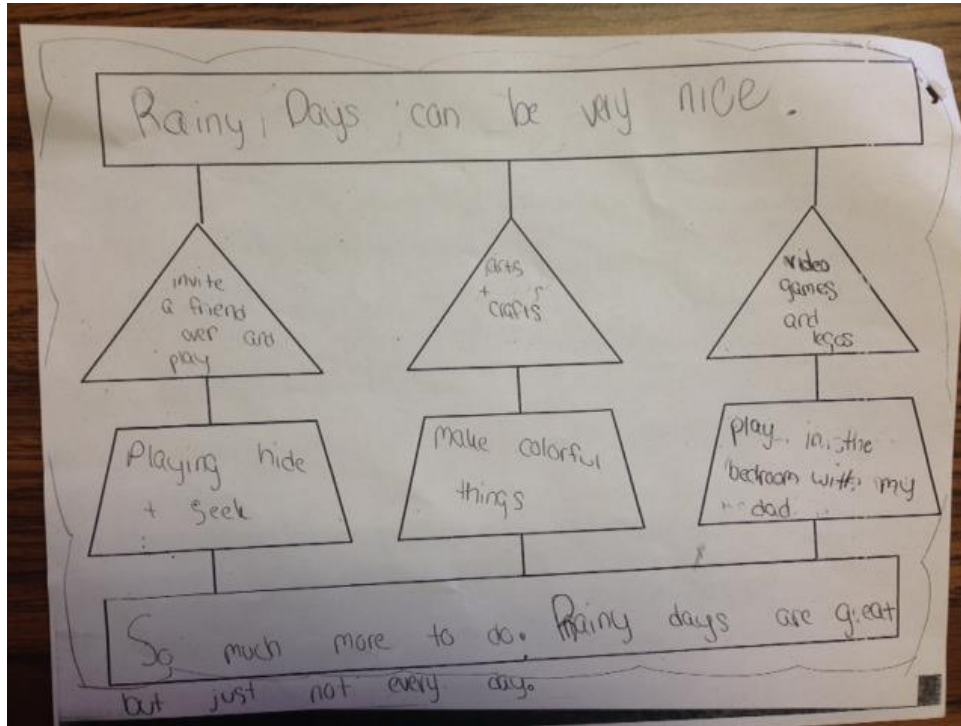

STATUS ON THE PROFESSIONAL PRACTICE GOAL

- Five (5) Developing Educator Plans were completed on TeachPoint
- Seven (7) Self Directed Year 2 Growth Plans were completed on TeachPoint.

School Goals

IMPROVE SCHOOL / HOME COMMUNICATION

- Develop a school wide survey with the School Council .
- Send home weekly updates to parents through the “Dorrance Dialogue” available to all parents online.



IMPROVE THE HEATH BROOK LIBRARY

- Increase the number of Non-Fiction books in our library.
- Make the library more appropriate for the K,1,2 student population by removing old stacks, provide more open spaces and more suitable seating arrangements.



STATUS ON SCHOOL GOALS

- School Council met from November to May to develop a parent survey. We are still working on this survey and hope to have it ready in the fall.
- The Heath Brook email blast is sent every Sunday to 98% of parents. This communication includes a weekly message called “Dorrance Dialogue”.



IMPROVE THE HEATH BROOK LIBRARY

Trained 47 volunteers and the entire staff to implement the Destiny Computer Program for book distribution.

100% of the 147 new books in our library are Non-fiction.

New rugs and chairs have been installed in the library.



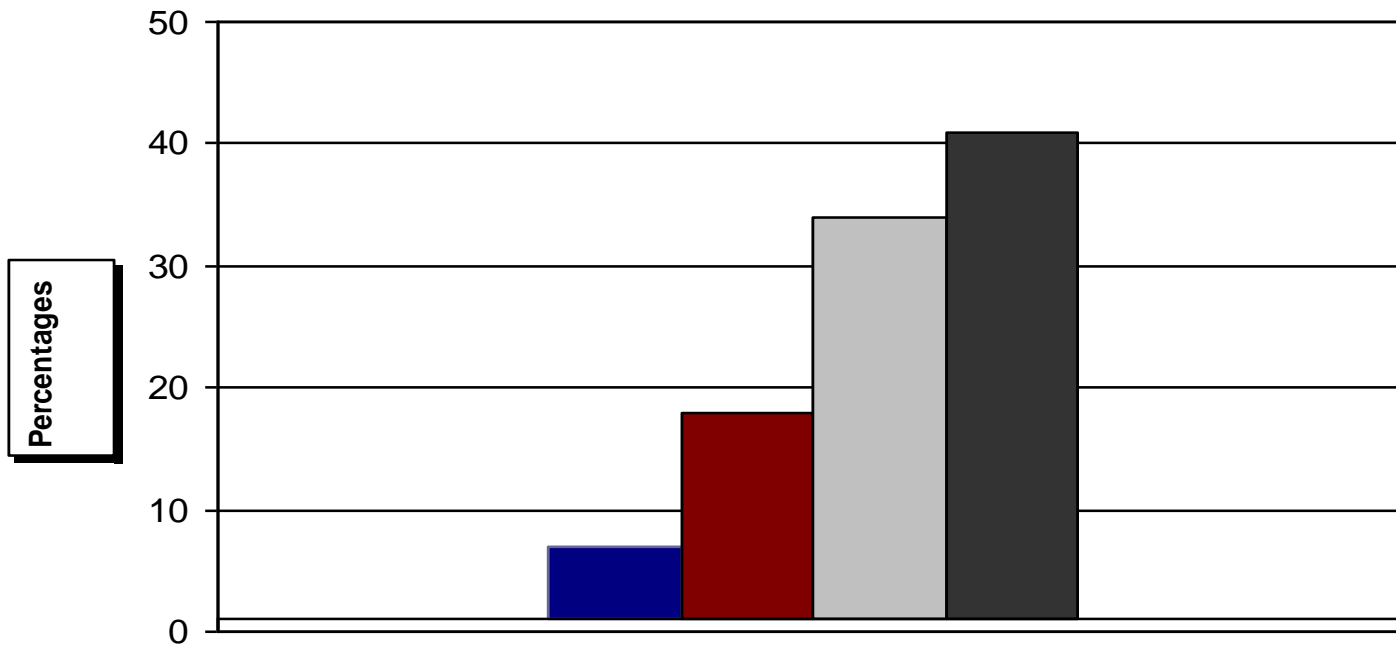

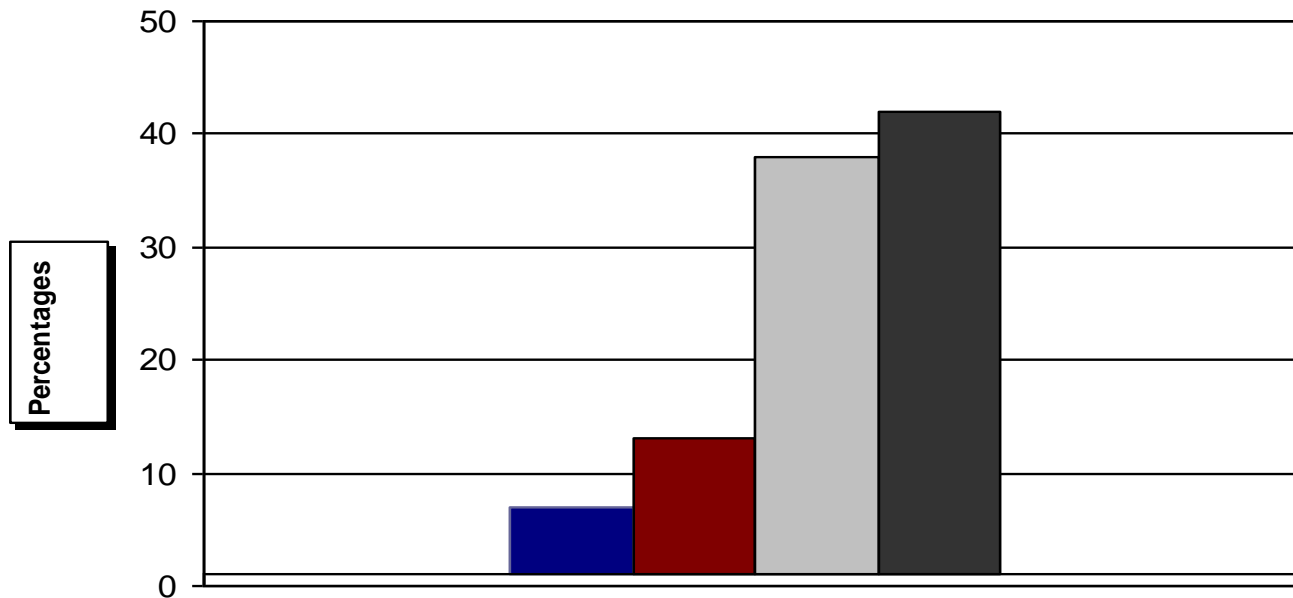

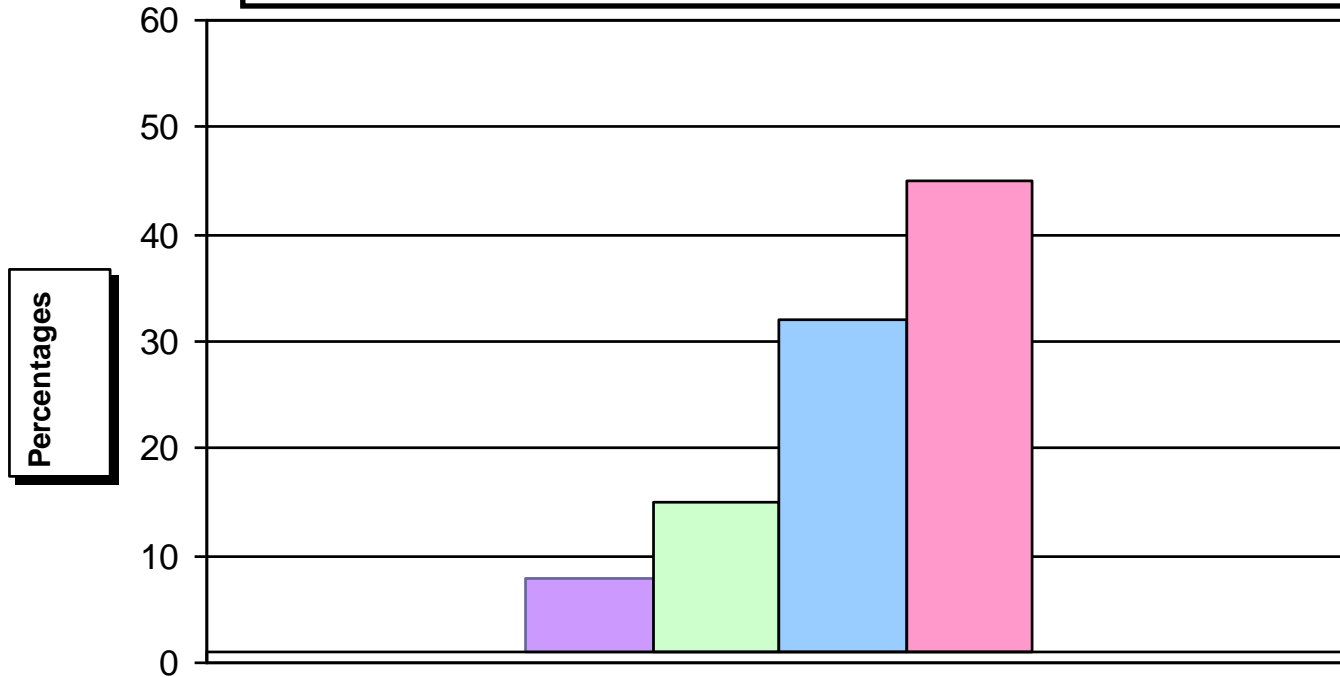

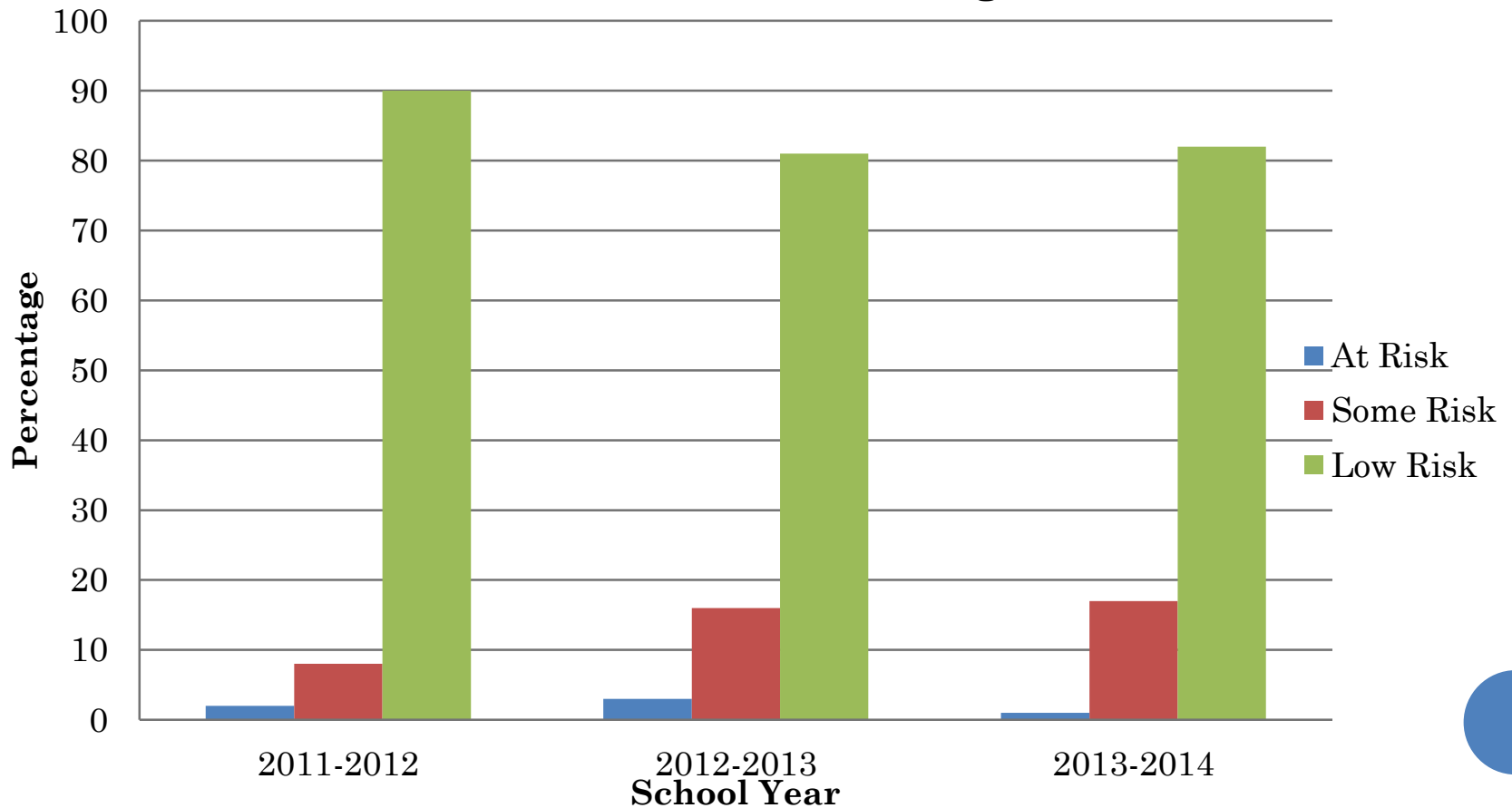

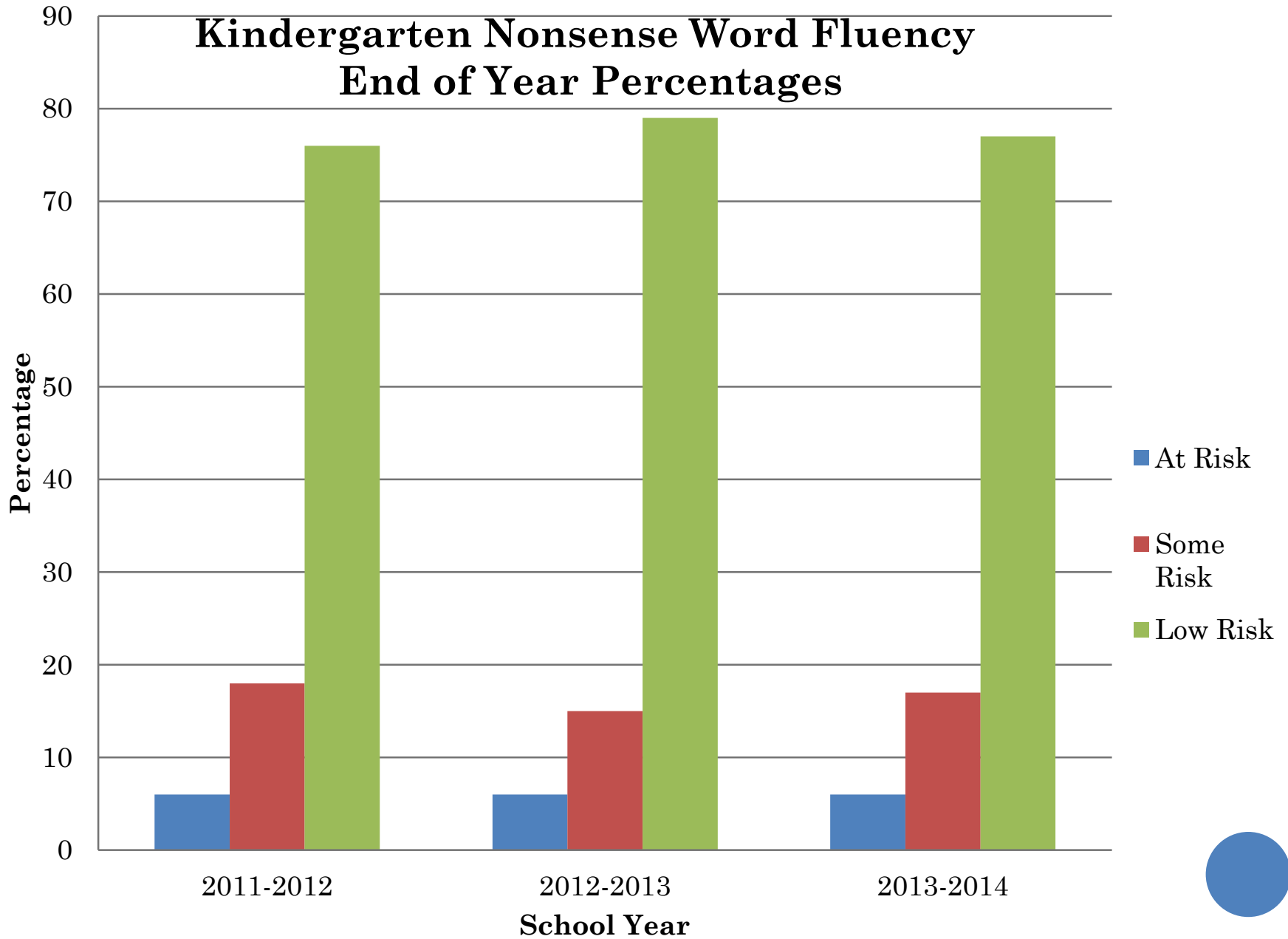

Kindergarten Phoneme Segmentation Fluency End of the Year Percentages

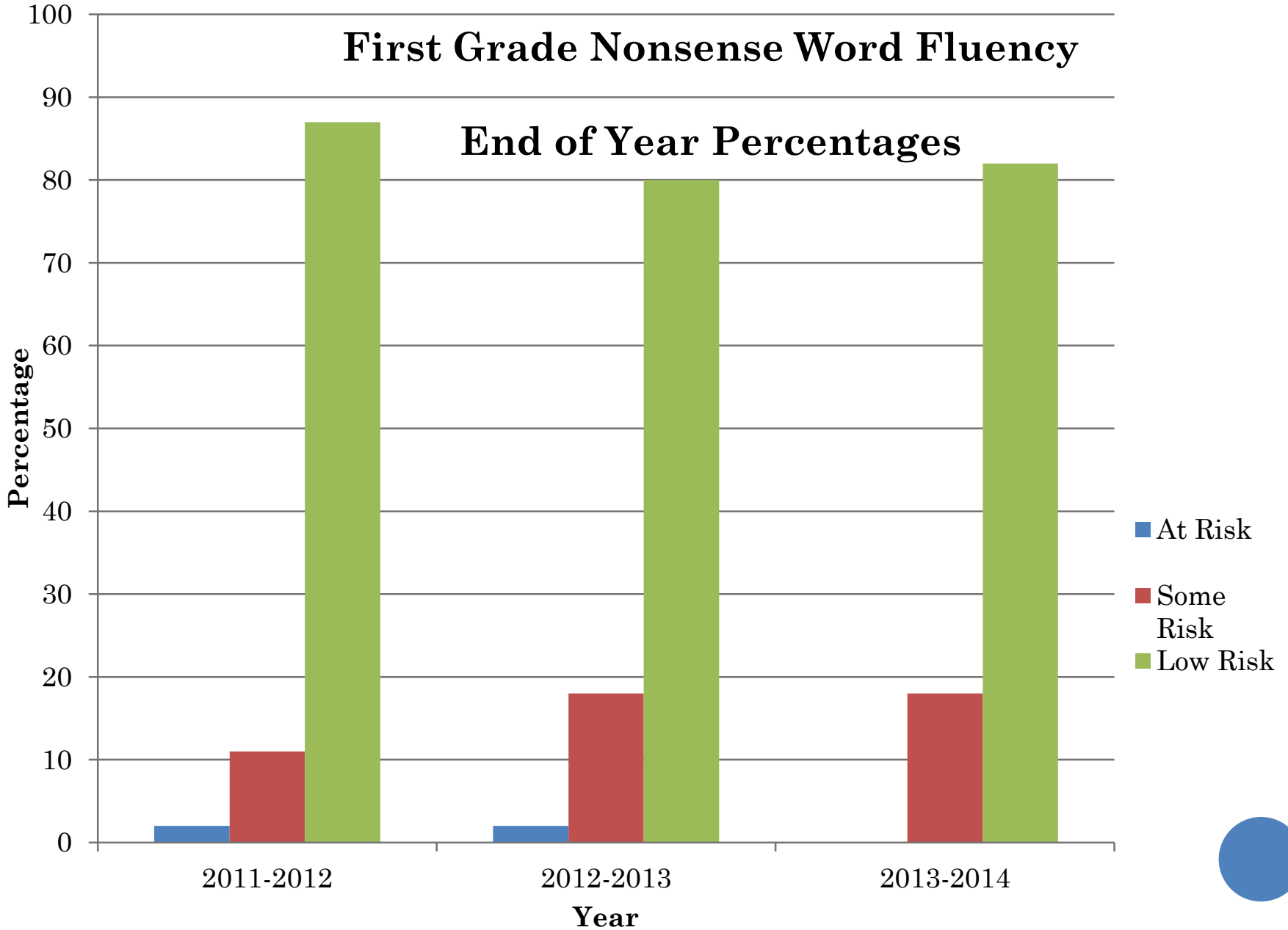


Kindergarten Nonsense Word Fluency End of Year Percentages

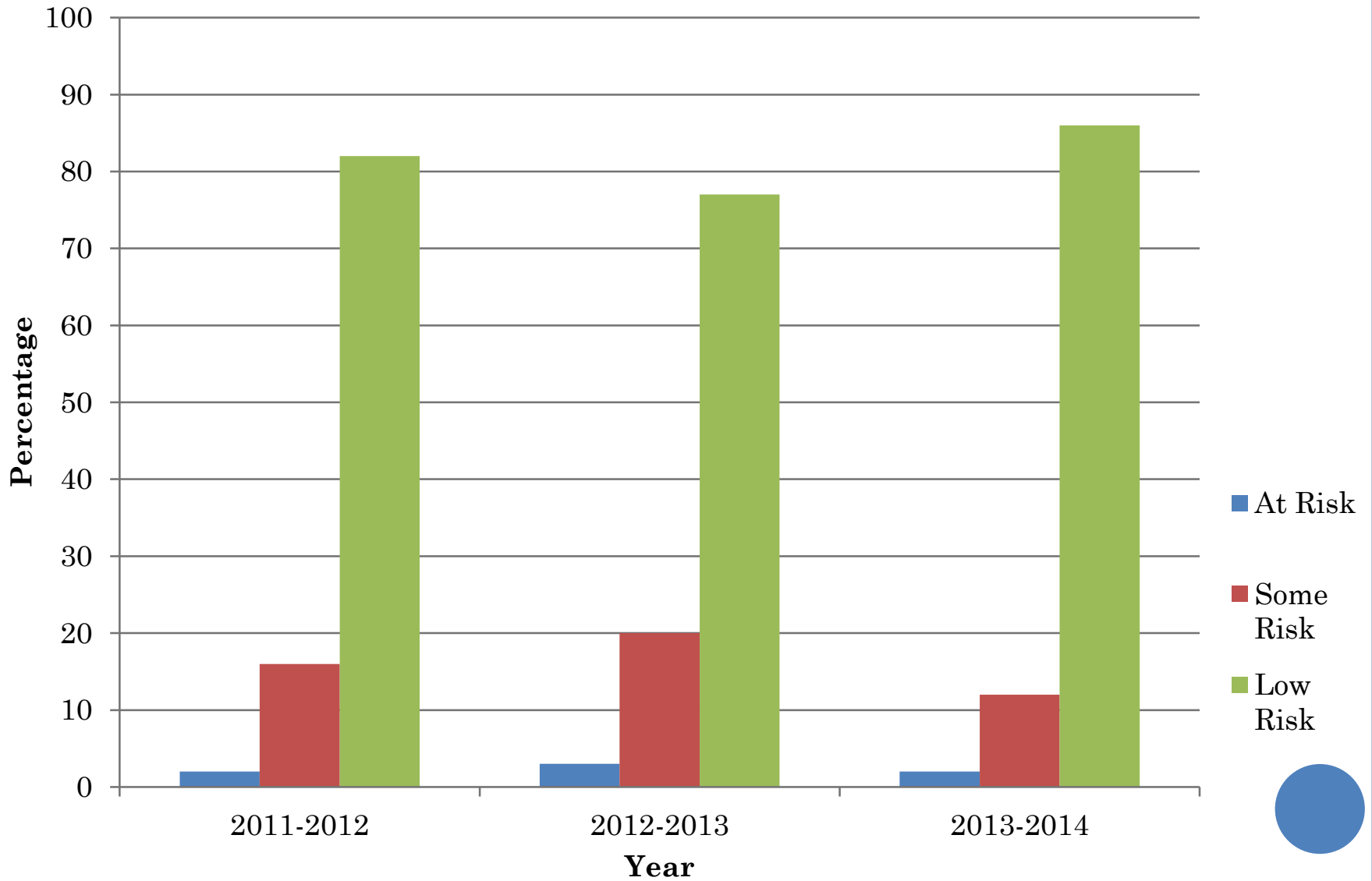


First Grade Nonsense Word Fluency

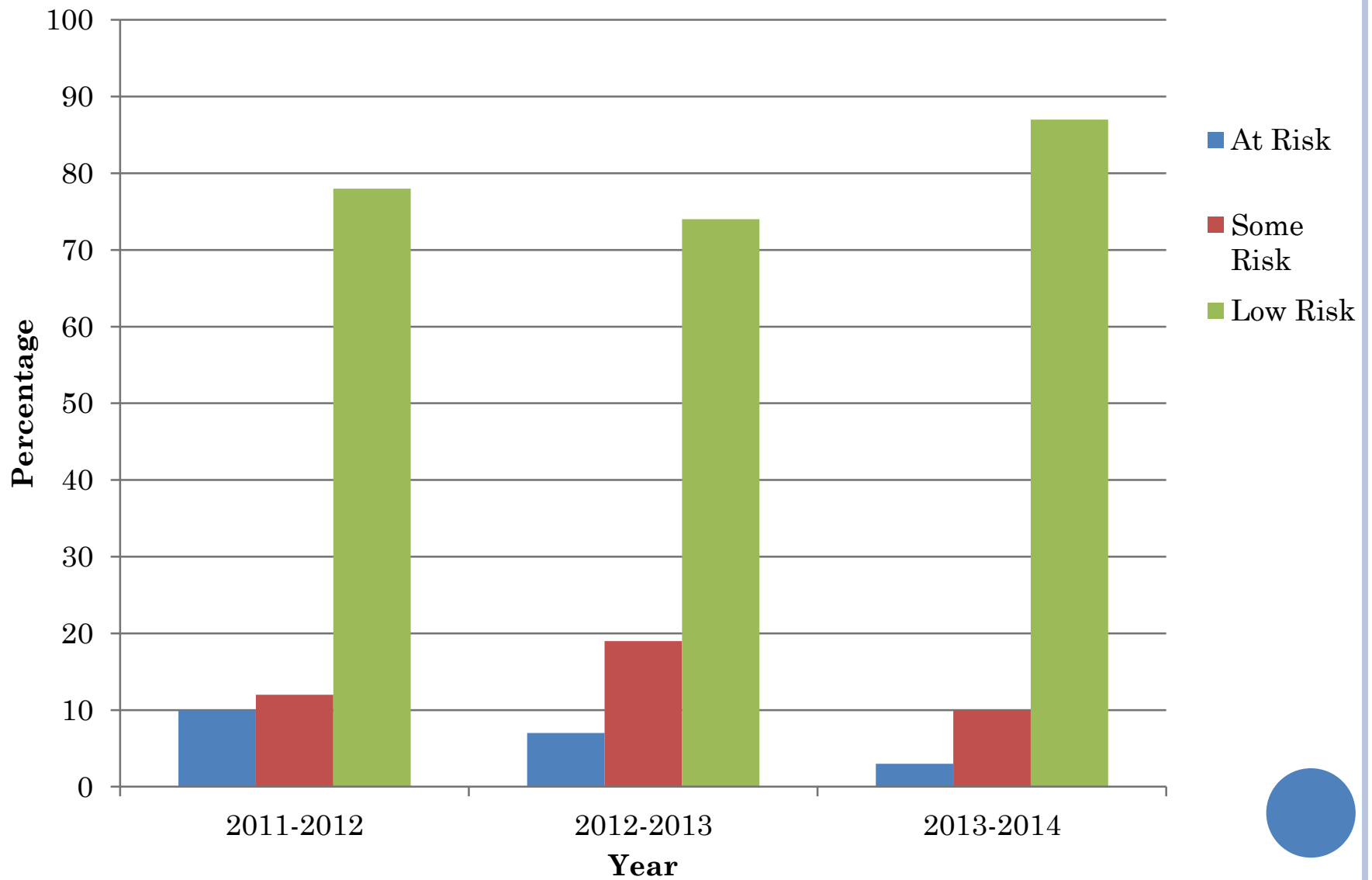
End of Year Percentages



First Grade Oral Reading Fluency End of Year Percentages

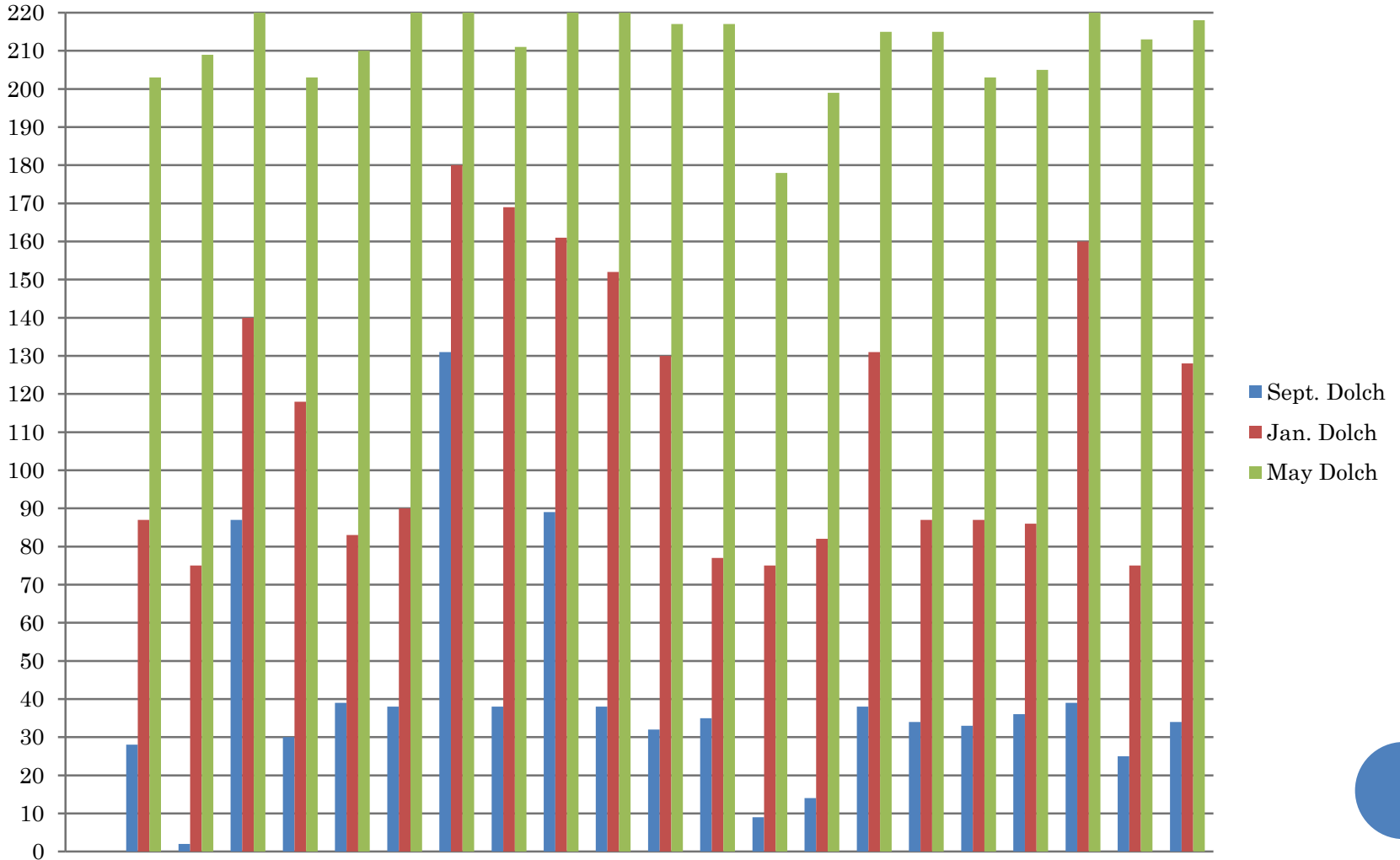


Second Grade Oral Reading Fluency End of Year Percentage

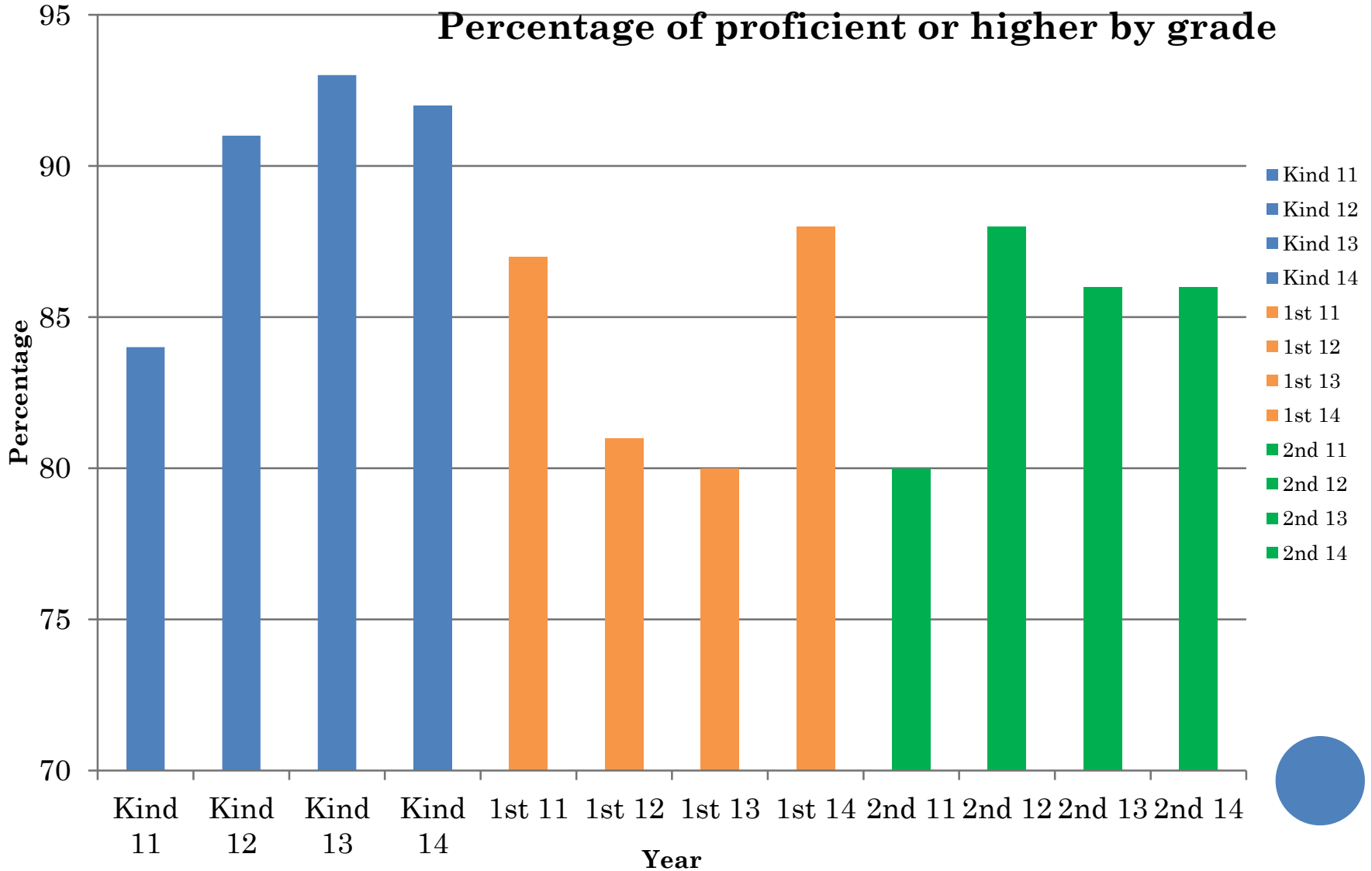
Ventura Dolch Sight Word Progress

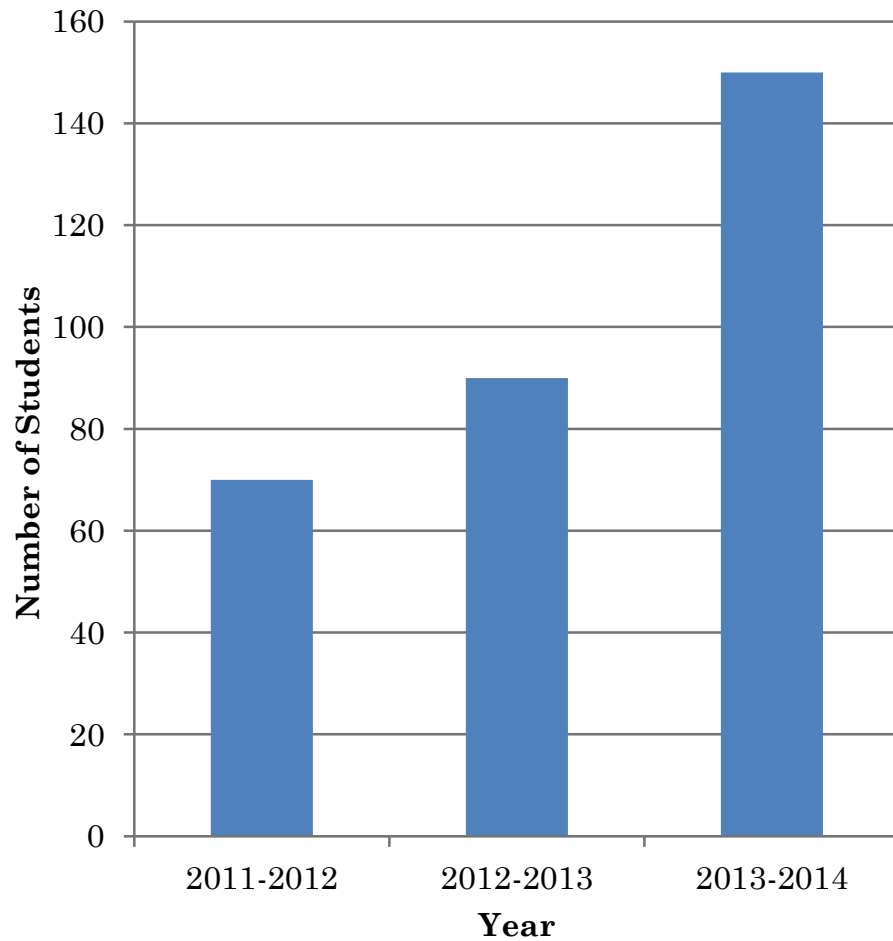

HEATH BROOK SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT GOALS 2014-2015

Student Goal

Design and develop a new RTI program. Progress Monitor all struggling students every six weeks.

By June 2015 100% of all RTI students will increase their reading level by at least one grade level.



School/Instructional Improvement Goal

Institute monthly grade level meetings to share best practices, collect data and improve instruction in reading, writing and math.



Professional Improvement Goal

Increase the time spent on classroom observation and walk throughs.

At least two hours per week will be set aside for principal/classroom visits. This will be monitored through the principal's calendar and Teach Point data.
