



ELA-Percentage of Students Scoring Proficient or Above




Math-Percentage of Students Scoring Proficient or Above




SCIENCE MCAS PERFORMANCE (GRADE 8)

Science And Technology/Engineering Percentage of Students Advanced and Proficient




MATH SUBGROUP PERFORMANCE (ENTIRE SCHOOL)

Mathematics—Wynn Middle School Percentage Advanced/Proficient by Subgroup




ELA SUBGROUP PERFORMANCE (ENTIRE SCHOOL)


