It is hard to believe that we have been back at school for a month already! We had a terrific start with the new schedule. College Process

The Guidance Department pleased to host the annual Senior Parent Breakfast and Senior Student assembly on Friday, September 23rd. Representatives from UMass Lowell, Merrimack College, Fitchburg State University, Southern New Hampshire University and Middlesex Community College were on hand to explain aspects of the application process. Susan Woods, Associate Dean of Student Support Services at Middlesex Community College provided information to parents on how students can access support services in college.

On October 7th, an admission representative from Fitchburg State University will be visiting TMHS for our annual College Essay Writing Workshop. The eight year collaboration with Fitchburg State University has assisted many graduating students with producing outstanding college essays. Students interested in attending should bring a rough draft essay to be reviewed.

All seniors will have individual appointments with their counselor to provide guidance and any assistance with the application process. Recommendation letters and accompanying student evaluation forms will be sub-

mitted by the counselor via Naviance. Students will be required to update their Naviance accounts throughout the senior year to reflect their applications and the application status.

We remind students that scholarships are beginning to arrive in the Guidance office. Students can visit the Guidance webpage, the Career Center, or their Naviance accounts to access the latest available scholarships and the posted deadlines.

PSATs

TMHS will be administering the PSAT exam on Saturday, October 15th. Students should bring two number 2 pencils with them and a CollegeBoard approved calculator. Approved devices are listed in the

booklet provided to students when they registered for the exam. Students should arrive to the high school by 7:40am for registration and room assignment. Students are allowed to bring a water and a sealed snack. No

coffees will be allowed beyond the cafe. Please note, no student will be admitted into the building after 8:00am, per CollegeBoard regulations.

Transcript Requests

Students need to complete an official transcript request form for all scholarship applications with the transcript requirement. The transcript request form is not needed for counselors to forward student transcripts via Naviance.

Oh How Our Garden Grows!!!



Busy bees and human hands have helped to keep things blooming in the TMHS vegetable garden in the last few months. Our garden began with two raised beds constructed and planted by the 2015 summer program students as part of their service learning project. Produce grown in our first season was donated to the Tewksbury Community Pantry and used in our own lunch program last fall. In the spring of this year, Environmental Science students doubled the size of the garden by constructing two new beds. They then added seedlings started indoors to the soil while also planting a variety of vegetables from seed. Throughout the summer of 2016, a variety of fresh produce, including lettuce, Swiss chard, arugula, zucchini, cucumbers and tomatoes were harvested and donated to the

Pantry itself or to the Pantry table at the Tewksbury Farmer's Market on the Town's common.

The summer of 2016 also brought some major changes to the gardening space outside our doors. As part of their service learning project, this year's summer program students chose to construct handicapped-accessible raised beds so that the students of the Life Skills program would have the opportunity to grow their own vegetables for the salads and sandwiches they prepare and sell to the faculty each week.

Summer program students researched the suggested dimensions for handicapped accessibility, determined what supplies were needed and then constructed and prepared the new beds for planting. One stu-

dent, Ryan Kwiatkowski, chose to build a wheelchair-accessible planting table at home with his dad's help and donate it to the project.

Many thanks are due to people behind the scenes whose efforts contributed to the success of the project, including the Tewksbury Public Schools Maintenance and Facilities Departments who gathered and modified project supplies to help our students execute their plan.

On planting day, the Life Skills summer program students joined the project team to plant seeds in their new garden beds and celebrate with icecream treats. Several local newspapers were on scene to document the action and publicize our success! This article was submitted by
