### **Academic Program**

All yearlong courses are worth 5 credits. All semester courses are worth 2.5 credits. Students take seven courses each semester using a seven-day rotating schedule. The daily schedule consists of five 68-minute courses.

## **Noteworthy Educational Opportunities**

#### **Innovation Pathways**

Innovation Pathways are structures within high schools that are designed to connect student learning to a broadly-defined industry sector that is in demand in the regional and state economy. Students in this program participate in a series of courses and experiences to achieve industry-recognized credentials and are given opportunities for summer internships within their chosen sector. Students are welcomed during their sophomore or junior year to meet with their guidance counselor to review eligibility.

#### **Senior Project**

This fourth-quarter, off-campus experience provides eligible seniors with an opportunity to apply 21st century skills in realworld settings. Students may pursue externships with businesses or professional organizations, participate in a community service project, or complete a research paper or project.

### **Dual Enrollment (DE)**

TMHS has partnered with Middlesex Community College to provide students with opportunities to take college-credit bearing courses while completing their requirements for high school graduation. Junior and senior students are currently eligible to participate in the Dual Enrollment Program. DE courses are weighted at a minimum of Honors credit to be determined on a course-by-course basis.
