Academic Program

All yearlong courses are worth 5 credits. All semester courses are worth 2.5 credits. Typically, students take seven courses each semester using a seven-day rotating schedule. The daily schedule consists of five 68-minute courses.

During the 2020-2021 academic year Tewksbury Memorial High School followed a hybrid-learning model. All students still took seven courses each semester, but the daily schedule consisted of five 58-minute courses, as well as a 15-minute flexible block which was used for extra help, meetings with school counselors, remediation, and/or social-emotional learning activities. Students were given the choice to participate in hybrid learning, which consisted of two half-days of in-person learning followed by three days of remote learning, or full-time remote learning. During the fourth quarter, we returned to a full-day, in-person schedule. All classes were taught by TMHS teachers. Graduation requirements remained the same.

Since the beginning of the 2021-22 academic year, TMHS has returned to full days of in-person learning, with a focus on accelerated learning for all students

Noteworthy Educational Opportunities

Senior Project

This fourth-quarter, off-campus experience provides eligible seniors with an opportunity to apply 21st century skills in real-world settings. Students may pursue externships with businesses or professional organizations, participate in a community service project, or complete a research paper or project.

Early College Courses (EC) also referred to as Dual Enrollment (DE)

TMHS has partnered with Middlesex Community College and Southern New Hampshire University to provide students with opportunities to take college-credit bearing courses while completing their requirements for high school graduation. Junior and senior students are eligible to participate in the Dual Enrollment Program. DE courses are weighted the same as Advanced Placement coursework. Current course offerings include Accounting, Anatomy & Physiology, Biology, Calculus, International Relations, Introduction to Drawing, Senior English, Statistics, and US History.
