- 2. Voted to approved up to \$1500 to cover subscriptions for Reading A-Z & RAZ Kid . Approved.
- 3. Voted to approve \$817.39 for Guided Reading Library at Trahan. Approved.
- 4. Voted to approve \$600 for start up costs to order a supply of T-shirts to have on hand to sell at various events. Approved.

## Principals' Report

- 1. Trahan Mr. Castonguay
  - a. Scholastic-Leveled Book Room adopted a new benchmarking system (scholastic) connected to guiding reading levels. This allows teachers to sign out books that are right at the students' instructional level. There are fiction, nonfiction and short read strands among others. Program costs about \$10,000.
  - b. Thursday top summer readers will be lucky enough to have lunch with Mr C. and Ms. Graves
  - c. Four people are interested in serving on the Trahan School Council and are putting together a candidate statement. Statements will be sent via e-mail to parents in Trahan community who will vote until this Friday to determine who will be on the council
  - d. This Friday is the first Parent Coffee with the Principal at 9:30am. Agenda was e-mailed out the Trahan community earlier today.
  - e. Teachers have begun preparing kids on ALICE. This is a review for students and a drill will be conducted next week.
  - f. Dictionaries will be given to Grade 3 students on 10/21 by the Tewksbury Elks.
  - g. Trahan Library night 10/25th. From 6-7pm, Mr. C. be handing out raffle tickets to win a prize pack.

- 1. Trahan Lori Hyland
  - a. AR Program is up and running. Looking into purchasing prizes for top readers.
  - b. Mr. C & Mrs. Hyland were presenters at the Bruin Workshop "I CAN EXCEL". Multiple activities to do outside the textbook based on the Bruins. Ms. Hyland used graphing about All third graders are graphing and Ms. Hyland used Bruins (countries from, ages, height) as a unique way to work on the concept

- 1. Review of Treasurer's Report

  Total cost \$1,849.05. Voted and approved.
  - a. Ms. Wettstone has volunteered to give the rest of her principal budget to use for these subscriptions. Approximately \$500 left to give towards this.
  - b. It is was asked for it to be noted that by general membership that this is an administrative cost and should not be the responsibility of the PAC.
