PRESENTATIONS

TMHS Spanish Department – 2017 Trip to Spain Presentation

Mr. Malone invited the students and Spanish teachers, Grace Dudley and Bethany Beauchesne, to present the highlights of the TMHS 2017 trip to Spain. Ms. Beauchesne related that 38 students from Tewksbury Memorial High School and chaperones went on the 2017 trip. The students presented a PowerPoint of pictures highlighting the cities they visited relating what they learned while having fun.

Ms. Polimeno commented that the Committee appreciates the students coming and presenting this evening adding that these trips are all about the experiences, learning and memories. Ms. Dudley remarked that it is also about students becoming global.

Ms. Regan reported that on the Consent Agenda is another item regarding TMHS students in AP Spanish classes working with students at the Dewing and North Street Schools, asking Ms. Dudley to report on the topic. Ms. Dudley told the School Committee about the TMHS students preparing lessons for a one hour class, reading the *Hungry Caterpillar* and *Brown* Bear, completely in Spanish. The objective was to help the students see what it is like to be in the shoes of Spanish speaking children in the classrooms. Ms. Dudley commented that the lesson learned is empathy.

SBIRT – Elaine Walsh, Head Nurse

Ms. Walsh addressed the School Committee presenting information on SBIRT (Screening, Brief, Interventions, and Referral to Treatment) relating that it is an evidence-based questionnaire used in trying to make sure kids are safe; designed for teenagers to identify if they are having drug and/or alcohol problems. She reported that in 2016, MA Legislature introduced a Bill requiring schools to implement the SBIRT system. MA Department of Health (DOH) and MA Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE) worked together with school nurses and guidance counselor to build relationships with students. Ms. Walsh reported the district is required to notify parents of students at the Wynn Middle School and TMHS by mail prior to the start of the new school year adding that the district will also inform parents before students take the questionnaire. Grades seven and nine will be screened by the end of the 2017-2018 school year as stipulated by the new state law. Ms. Walsh presented the questionnaire to the School Committee. Ms. Walsh answered questions from the School Committee. Mr. Malone reported the district will post messages on the district's website. At the request of the School Committee, updates will be on the School Committee Consent Agenda.

Transition Leadership North Street School

Mr. Malone reported that Ms. Kimble will work with the district to support the new principal, Karen Cronin. Mr. Malone welcomed Ms. Cronin to the Tewksbury Public Schools.

Table Top Emergency Exercise

Mr. Malone reported that on June 6, 2017, the District Security Team partnered with the PanAm Railways at the recent Table Top exercises.

Kindergarten Orientation

Mr. Malone gave *Hats-off* to the Kindergarten teachers for coming together with the aides to revamp kindergarten orientation at the Heath Brook and Dewing Elementary Schools relating the recommendation is to shift the timeframe in order to offer a daytime and evening for Kindergarten Orientation. He stated that families will be able to go into classrooms and students will be able to participate in events on the playground while parents receive orientation information.

Spelling Bee

Mr. Malone congratulated the winners of the TEF 2017 Annual Spelling Bee.

Heat in Buildings

Mr. Malone reported the district is monitoring the heat in the buildings, bringing in water and purchased industrial fans for hallways.

The district will be utilizing prisoners this year for a two week span, there will be painting done at the North Street School, the district will hire TMHS students for the IT and the Maintenance Department
