## CALL TO ORDER

Ms. Polimeno called the Regular School Committee meeting to order at 5:00 p.m. Ms. Polimeno announced the School Committee will be convening an Executive Session to continue discussion relative to strategy with respect to collective bargaining or litigation. The Public Budget Hearing will begin at 5:30 p.m., followed by the Regular School Committee meeting at 6:00 p.m. Ms. Polimeno reported the School Committee will attend the Town Finance Committee meeting at 8:00 p.m.

Mr. Francis moved, seconded by Ms. Bennett, to enter into an Executive Session to continue discussion relative to strategy with respect to collective bargaining and/or litigation. The School Committee will reconvene in Open Session at. 5:30 p.m. for a Public Budget Hearing.

Roll Call Vote: Voting Yes: Mr. Sullivan, Mr. Francis, Ms. Bennett, and Ms. Polimeno. All Aye. No Opposed. Unanimous Vote. Motion carried 4-0. Mr. Cutelis arrived at 5:05 p.m.

At 5:28 p.m, Mr. Francis moved, seconded by Ms. Bennett to adjourn the Executive Session and reconvene the Regular School Committee meeting. All Aye. No Opposed. Unanimous Vote. Motion carried 5-0.

At 5:35 p.m., Ms. Polimeno welcomed the community to the Public Hearing on the Budget. She announced that the School Committee invites public comments on the budget. When addressing the Committee the public should state their name, street address and direct questions and/or comments to the Chair. Ms. Polimeno stated that there will be no comments from the School Committee tonight. She reported the next Public Hearing on the budget will be held on March 21, 2018.

#### PUBLIC HEARING BUDGET

Ms. Matthews, Director of Business Services, apologized for the delay in presenting the hearing due to rescheduling the meeting three different times due to the weather. Ms. Matthews presented the FY19 Public Budget Hearing to the the School Committee and the community.

Approved April 11, 2018 Ms. Matthews presented the FY19 Public Hearing on the Budget. The report is broken down by Regular Education accounts and Special Education accounts as submitted to the Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE). This is a negotiating year, all the Collective Bargaining line items for salaries, only indicaticate step and lanes and not the percent of salary increase. Ms. Matthews pointed out the increases in the FY19 budget over the FY18 budget.

Ms. Matthews reported that the overall increase in the Regular Education budget is 1.16% or \$356,915.00. The overall increase in the Special Education budget is 1.77% or \$180,662.00. The FY19 Local Appropriation for the Tewksbury Public Schools is \$890,312.00, an overall increase of 3.31% or \$1,503,514.00. This includes level funding of our Capital Outlay of \$314,500.00. Ms. Matthews reported the Budget Summary lines up with the Town Manager's recommended school budget of \$57,344,864.00, this includes a portion of fixed costs handled by the Town. Our salaries are \$33,388,551.00, our operating costs are \$13,264,271.00, the Capital Outlay is level funded at \$314,500.00. The total Local Appropriation is \$46,967.322.00.

Ms. Matthews completed the Public Budget Hearing. Ms. Polimeno opened for comments and questions from the School Committee. In response to a question from Mr. Sullivan, Ms. Matthews will correct the percentage increase to the Regular Education for the next Public Hearing. Mr. Francis requested to add grant funding to the tiered requests. Ms. Matthews will work with Mr. Malone to look at the grant funding. Mr. Malone reported that the state has reduced grant funding for districts adding that the district will become more aggressive looking for grant opportunities.

Ms. Polimeno reported that Ms. Matthews was readily available to the meet with School Committee members on the FY19 budget. She thanked Ms. Matthews for putting together a sound budget, the Town Manager, Finance Committee, and the Board of Selectmen for supporting the district. Ms. Polimeno announced that the community may contact Ms. Matthews if you have questions concerning the budget.

Ms. Polimeno asked if anyone would like to speak or comment on the budget. Seeing none, Ms. Polimeno asked for a motion to close the Public Hearing on the Budget.

Mr. Francis moved, seconded by Ms. Bennett to close the Public Budget Hearing. All Aye. No Opposed. Unanimous Vote. Motion carried 5-0.

#### Notes From Tewksbury Memorial High School

Grace Morris reported on the news from Tewksbury Memorial High School:

- NHS finalized candidates for NHS. They had their induction for members of the junior class on Monday night, which went very well. The seniors are finishing up their individual service projects, and Ms. Puma is sad to see that the seniors will be leaving soon.
- SADD is supporting the National Student Walk Out, which is being rescheduled to March 21st, hoping it will result in a positive change.
- Student Council is headed to Hyannis for their Annual State Conference MASC on March 7th, 8th and 9th, where they learned many new leadership skills. Two TMHS students Mercy Olu and Grace Morris won the Commonwealth award for our dedication to the council.
- Math Team's most recent meet was at Beverly High School, where they placed third. The competitors were chosen by the schools' scores throughout the year, so it was a cumulative event.
- Science Bowl had their competition at UCONN this Saturday, eight students attended along with advisor Ms. Barnett, and they had a very fun time, doing very well in chemistry, earth and space science, and biology questions. They also enjoyed some delicious ice cream from UCONN's Dairy Bar.
- International Club's next service project is on Earth day, April 21st, where they will clean up trash and do some planting on Whipple Road. They are also raising funds through Monday morning breakfast sales, and a car wash in May, which they will donate to a local trash receptacle for the Town.
- Best Buddies had an awesome trip to the New England Aquarium. Thirty-eight kids went on the field trip on Sunday, March 4th. Their next big event is the Best Buddies Ball in Bedford on March 24th, which is a big dance with other Best Buddies in the area.
- DECA had their State Conference on March 8th, 9th and 10th, where they had 27 students attend. It was held
  at the Copley Marriott Hotel in Boston and they had two medal winners: Senior Emily Milne, finishing 8th place
  overall in the Accounting and Applications event area and Freshman Mihir Bagul, finishing in 7th place overall
  in Principles of Finance event area. It was a terrific conference overall and one that all TMHS students did well
  in. Mr. Sullivan would like to thank the School Committee, administration, and the teachers for their help and
  continued support of our program.
- Robotics had their first competition, where they basically worked with their robot for the first time. After rewiring, they found themselves in the middle but are ready to take on the next competition and fix their mistakes.

Mr. Cutelis asked Ms. Morris about the walk-out planned on March 24th. Ms. Morris related that most students are interested in participating in the event in memory of the 17 deaths at the Florida high school. Mr. Malone remarked that a significant part of the event would be that it is student driven to do something in remembrance and support relating the event will be 17 minutes long for the 17 victims. Mr. Malone reported the administration will support students on their decision but shall not take a stance.

## Program of Studies

Ms. Regan reported on the TMHS Program of Studies relating it will improve student programming, recognition, and awards. Ms. Regan reported that Principal Vogel provided the School Committee with bulleted changes in the Program of Studies document. In response to a comment from Ms. Polimeno, Ms. Regan reported that the requested edits will be made to the document. Ms. Polimeno opened for questions and/or comments from the School Committee. Seeing none, she recommended the School Committee vote to approve the 2018-2018 Program of Studies.

Mr. Francis moved to adopt the Tewksbury Memorial High School's 2018-2019 Program of Studies, subject to any edits or typo corrections, seconded by Ms. Bennett. Roll Call Vote: Mr. Sullivan, Mr. Francis, Mr. Cutelis, Ms. Bennett and Ms. Polimeno. Unanimous Vote. Motion carried 5-0.

**College Planning Guide, Post-Secondary Transition Planning, and the Innovation Pathways Program** Ms. Regan presented the changes to the College Planning Guide to the School Committee. Ms. Polimeno opened for questions and/or comments from the School Committee. Seeing none, she recommended for the School Committee vote to approve the document.

Mr. Francis moved, seconded by Ms. Bennett, to approve the Tewksbury Memorial High School's 2018-2019 College Planning Guide as presented. Roll Call Vote: Mr. Sullivan, Mr. Francis, Mr. Cutelis, Ms. Bennett and Ms. Polimeno. Unanimous Vote. Motion carried 5-0.

Ms. Regan reported on the Innovation Pathways Program relating that this is for information only, no vote from the School Committee is required tonight. She reported that Guidance Counselor, Karen Baker O'Brien will present to the School Committee once the grant selection has been made.

## **Global Competency Certificate**

Ms. Regan reported on the Global Competency Certification relating that the certification will be geared to students who have that absolute focus and desire to help save the world with global study. The district will pilot the Seal of Biliteracy, a recognition program to be literate in two languages.

Ms. Regan reported that TMHS Spanish teachers, Graca Dudley and Beth Beauchesne, have worked very hard and will present on the Global Competency at the March 21st. She reported the School Committee will be asked to vote on the Global Competency Certificate program at that time.

#### **CITIZEN'S FORUM**

Ms. Polimeno inquired if there was anyone in the audience wishing to speak on any item on the agenda. Dina Mancini, Kenneth Lane, Tewksbury, addressed the Committee on the ACE program. She inquired how a decision was made with only a three (3) month pilot. Mr. Malone addressed the question, responding that there will be a community meeting on the pilot program in which her question could be addressed. Ms. Regan reported the recommendation to adopt the program will be tabled to April 11th. The District will not make a recommendation to approve the program until after the community information evening. They may send questions to Mr. Malone or Mr. Pelletier. Ms. Polimeno moved onto approval of the Minutes.

#### SUPERINTENDENT REPORTS

# Mr. Malone presented the Superintendent's Report: Weather

Mr. Malone reported that due to the current weather pattern and over two feet of snow, the district had to cancel school. He is confident school will be open tomorrow. Mr. Malone thanked the district's maintenance for a great job clearing out the school lots and to the Town for clearing the roads. As of this date, we have missed eight days, with five days built into the calendar the last day of school was anticipated to be June 21st, add the additional three days we are looking at the last day to be June 26th. Mr. Malone reported the district is looking into options to make up the additional days, meeting with TTA Union, and welcoming suggestions. The decision made must be best decision for the students.

#### Security

Mr. Malone reported that security is the highest priority for the district. We had an event at the high school last week concerning a student's comment which resulted in significant police response. Mr. Malone thanked the Tewksbury Police Department, the NEMLEC team and the great job done by the high school staff. He remarked that the district will look at lessons learned, continue training with ALICE and work with the District Security Team. Mr. Malone reported on two other events in which students had to be moved to other schools one due to a power outage at the Heath Brook School and the other a water outage at the Ryan School. Mr. Malone reported the district is going out to bid to update vestibules at schools and upgrade security measures.

Mr. Malone reported the National Honor Society (NHS) inducted over 100 students at the high school.

Mr. Malone reported the high school has a prerequisite to attend the junior prom. The district partnered with the MA District Attorney and the Tewksbury Police Department hosting a mandatory presentation event on making good choices; students and parents must attend in order to attend the junior prom.

#### Ms. Regan Presented the Assistant Superintendent's Report:

Ms. Regan reported the district is in the process of being audited on our Title I and Title IIA grants relating the Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education are monitoring and reviewing programs and how the funding is used.

Ms. Regan reported the kindergarten registration process was interrupted with snowstorms relating it has been rescheduled to March 12th with an evening registration rescheduled to March 22nd. Ms. Regan reported that both extended day and integrated preschool programs are full and the district has a wait list.

#### Ms. Matthews presented the Director of Business Services Report:

Ms. Matthews thanked the district custodians for helping with snow removal. She reminded the community that the Finance Committee meeting will be held tonight at 8:00 p.m. at the Town Hall relating they will review the district's budget.
