RECOGNITION

Annual Ginsburg Family Award - Wamesit Lanes "The MacLaren Family"

Mr. Ginsburg joined Mr. Malone in recognizing the recipients of the Annual Ginsburg Family Award. Kristen Vogel, Principal of Tewksbury Memorial High School, announced that Wamesit Lanes is the recipient of the 2018 Ginsburg Family Award, inviting Mr. Donald MacLaren, Sr. and Mr. Don MacLaren, Jr., up to accept the award. The MacLaren's received an engraved crystal trophy from the School Committee and the Tewksbury Public Schools. Ms. Polimeno announced that Mr. Ginsburg presented the MacLaren's with a check to be donated to the Tewksbury Public Schools in the name of the MacLaren's. The MacLaren's will be invited to join Mr. Ginsburg at a meeting with school administrators to determine how the donation will be used to benefit the students. On behalf of the School Committee, Principal Vogel presented Donald and Don MacLaren with a Resolution of Recognition.

Middlesex Partnership for Youth 2018 Elementary School Poster Project (K-5) Winner - Ava DeSario

Mr. Malone invited Mr. Castonguay, Principal of the Trahan Elementary School, and Margie Daniels, Director of the Middlesex Partnership for Youth, to recognize the winner of the MPY's 2018 Elementary School Poster Project, *Be The Change*. Ms. Daniels related the MPY holds an annual poster contest for grades 6-12, relating that this is the first year they added a poster contest for grades K-5. Ava DeSario, grade 4 at the Trahan School, is the first recipient to win the elementary poster contest out of 64 entries. Ms. Daniels presented Ava with a certificate and a gift and on behalf of the School Committee, Mr. Francis presented Ava with a Resolution of Recognition.

Mr. Malone announced that the School Committee is recognizing members of the Tewksbury Police Department this evening reporting on the partnership and collaboration between the Tewksbury Police Department and the Tewksbury Public Schools. The School Committee recognized Chief Timothy Sheehan, Detective Andre Gonzalez, School Resource Officers Doug Pratt, and James Ryser, Officer Jennie Welch, and Substance Abuse Prevention Program Director Maria Ruggiero. On behalf of the School Committee, Mr. Sullivan read and presented the group with a Resolution of Recognition.

STUDENT REPRESENTATIVE

Grace Morris, Student Council Member to the School Committee, presented the Notes From Tewksbury Memorial High School:

International Club had a breakfast on Monday morning and they have a car wash at MVP planned for this Saturday. With all of the proceeds from these fundraisers they are going to donate another trash receptacle to the Town.

SADD chose their presidents for next year and they are finishing up the year on a positive note.

Best Buddies are having a fundraiser on June 9th at Wamesit Lanes from 8-11AM. They will have bowling teams of five people participate and the cost is \$50 for each team. This is the only fundraiser they do all year, and this money goes towards all Best Buddies' sponsored events for the entire year.

NHS had volunteers help at the Power of Flowers last Sunday, they provided some volunteers for the Taste of Tewksbury last Monday, as well as Habitat for Humanity this past Saturday. On Friday, some members will be helping out with crafts at the Heath Brook's Ice Cream Social. Lastly, they are helping out with an MS fundraiser at Taki's Pizza in North Andover this weekend.

Student Council - This past week, Student Council sponsored Teacher Appreciation Week, in which they showed their appreciation for all teachers in the building through small gifts as well as an Ice Cream Day which Meadowlands Ice Cream provided. They are gearing up for Step Up Day, which is when the eighth graders come up to the high school, receive tours, listen to a panel, and visit the cafeteria for an activities fair.

Book Buddies - For the past couple of weeks, members of Book Buddies have visited the Dewing and North Street Schools to read books to K-4th graders.

ECHO will be making blankets with some of the senior residents at Heatherwood on Frida, and are getting ready for the Relay for Life fundraiser.

Peer Leadership had members with 5th grade Pen Pals visit the Ryan School today and meet their Pen Pals and played kickball. It was a very fun day and they hope that the 5th graders enjoyed their time.

Ms. Morris reported that she was one of the students on the six day trip to Iceland. She reported the group went to museums, a thermal plan, hiked a glacier and visited the Blue Lagoon Hot Springs. She stated that she would recommend the trip to others.

PRESENTATIONS

Community Services Extended Day Summer Program

Cynthia Basteri, Community Services Director Interim Director addressed the School Committee introducing members of the Leaders In Training (LIT) Program, Tom Morrill, Summer Program Coordinator, Jon DiPrima, LIT Director, and Michelle Silverio, LIT Service Learning Director. She reported they reviewed the previous program, ADVISORS, reporting they have changed the name to LIT . The team presented updates to the Community Services 2018 Summer Program. The program has been expanded for all high school students who have not yet attained a high school diploma. Mr. DiPrima presented and explained the four steps of the program relating that it is a tuition based program costing \$500. Mr. Morrill presented the orientation, interview and training process of the LIT Program. They are provided with workshops on how to prepare for the workplace. Ms. Silverio presented the new components of the LIT Program. The Committee members commented this is a tremendous program, they liked the new components and applaud their work. Dr. Basteri answered questions from the School Committee.

Tewksbury Memorial High School Student Club Fee Structure

Principal Kristen Vogel and Dave Libby, Finance & Operations Director, presented updates to Tewksbury Memorial High School's Student Club fee structure. Ms. Vogel presented a proposal to the School Committee to change the Student Club Fee Structure. She reported a Committee of students and staff looked at the current fee structure over the past two years. Ms. Vogel reported that the Committee feels that Clubs should be open to as many as possible and the fee structure should be equitable. The recommendation is to reduce the club fee to \$50 per student per club with a \$100 student cap per year. Further, the Committee recommends that in order to establish a new club they would require a minimum of fifteen students.

Ms. Polimeno entertained comments and questions from the School Committee. Mr. Cutelis would prefer not to charge fees for clubs though he knows that would not be possible. Ms. Vogel reported that hardship cases would be addressed. Mr. Francis agrees and Ms. Bennett appreciates the proposal. Mr. Sullivan does not agree with charging fees, he would like to know why some clubs to not pay fees and how much money is taken in yearly from the club fees. Ms. Vogel explained that if a club did community service, that club was not obligated to pay fees however, all clubs do community service now. In response to a question from Mr. Sullivan, Ms. Vogel explained that the National Honor Society is not a club, it is an honor, and an award to be a member, the Student Government Officers are elected, and are not a club. The Principal's Advisory is not a club, they are members of clubs and meet with Ms. Vogel as an advisor. Ms. Polimeno remarked that if is earned they would not pay. She asked that Ms. Vogel have it "spelled-out" in the Student Handbook. Ms. Polimeno supports the change.

Mr. Malone requested to move New Business item #5 to this portion of the meeting.

Mr. Francis moved, seconded by Ms. Bennett to accept the recommendation to revise the 2018-2019 Tewksbury Memorial High School's Club Activity Fee to \$50 per student per club with a \$100 student cap per year.

Roll Call Vote. Mr. Francis, Mr. Cutelis, Ms. Bennett, Mr. Sullivan, and Ms. Polimeno. All Aye. Unanimous Vote. Motion carried 5-0.

CITIZEN'S FORUM

Ms. Polimeno inquired if there was anyone in the audience wishing to speak on any item on the agenda. Several parents requested to speak on Mr. Castonguay's resignation on the Consent Agenda. Ms. Polimeno explained the policy and procedure to address the Committee during the Citizen's Forum relating that a speaker representing a group shall have ten minutes to address the Committee. She reported that the Committee members are always accessible and have responded to all who have contacted her adding that the Committee is always happy to talk with people however the Committee is not able to talk about personnel issues. Seeing that there were many people present, Ms. Polimeno stated that the Committee would entertain comments from a few key people that would like to speak and on same topic. Lauren Stewart, 8 Mark Road, Stephanie Bryant, 440 Boston Road, Gretchen Worst, 95 Regina S Drive, Christine Aiken, 296 Shawsheen Street, and Mercy Delgado, 42 Carleton Road, addressed the School Committee to share their disappointment and concern on the resignation of Mr. Castonguay. The parents support Mr. Castonguay and hoped the Committee would consider to rescind Mr. Castonguay's resignation.

Wynn Middle School Out of State Trip to NY

Mr. DiPrima addressed the School Committee requesting to approve an out-of-state field trip to New York City on Sunday, May 27, 2018 to attend a Broadway Show. The trip will be open to Ryan Elementary School students and Wynn Middle School students and this year to freshmen at Tewksbury Memorial High School, with a maximum of 50. The School Committee is supportive of the trip. Ms. Polimeno requested that Mr. Malone inform the School Committee of the final number of participants going on the trip.

Mr. Sullivan moved to approve the out-of-state day trip, with a maximum number of 50 participants from the Ryan School and Wynn School, May 27, 2018 to New York City to attend a Broadway show, seconded by Mr. Francis. All Aye. No Opposed. Unanimous Vote. Motion carried 5-0.

Mr. Malone reported that Ms. Gerrish and Ms. Wettstone are present to answer questions on the Elementary School Student Handbook. Ms. Gerrish reported the elementary school principals are submitting the same student handbook as last year. They reviewed the information and made minimal changes. Ms. Polimeno and the Committee all read the handbook and had a few minor changes. Ms. Gerrish reported the edits have been revised and the School Committee has received a final copy of the 2018-2019 Elementary School Student Handbook.

Mr. Cutelis moved, seconded by Mr. Francis, to approve the 2018-2019 Elementary Student Handbook. Roll Call Vote - Mr. Francis, Mr. Cutelis, Ms. Bennett, Mr. Sullivan, and Ms. Polimeno. All Aye. Unanimous Vote. Motion carried 5-0.

SUPERINTENDENT REPORTS

Mr. Malone Presented the Superintendent's Report:

Mr. Malone reported that Senator L'Italien is working on Circuit Breaker for schools hoping to get additional funding.

The district is doing landscaping work at the high school relating that students are involved in the planning. He pointed out the 2018-2019 calendar will be voted on tonight relating that the district received a waiver from the state regarding snow days. This impacts the schedule reporting that May 25th was a half day and is now a full day of school which will make the final day of school June 22nd. He reported this information will be messaged out to parents.

The district is addressing security measures in vestibules in all schools, working closely with Chief Sheehan. We are also looking at the front entrance at TMHS and will hire additional night security personnel at the high school.

Mr. Malone reported he attended the Academic Scholars Luncheon recognizing TMHS students, Stephanie Tam and Felicia Ragucci.

Ms. Regan pointed out on the Consent Agenda is a recognition of the Annual Art Show participants. She noted that the Best of Show artwork is on display at the Center School. Ms. Regan gave a *Hats Off!* to the performance of the Band and Chorus Concert at the Art Show.

Ms. Regan reported that last Thursday our Math and STEM team hosted a breakfast sponsored by the Lowell Workforce. The Secretary of State encouraged businesses to partner with our schools. Ms. Regan thanked the businesses relating it was most enlightening when they talked about the students going into their business each day.

Ms. Regan reported the Academic Excellence Awards will be held on Wednesday, May 23, 2018 at 1:00 p.m., inviting the School Committee to attend the event.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Elementary School Building Committee

Mr. Francis presented the ESBC report meetings are continuing monthly. The PDP design was submitted to MASB as one of the final steps in the Feasibility Study Phase. Mr. Francis pointed out the steps, the plan and the site needs and evaluations of alternative designs.

Mr. Francis reported on upcoming ESBC activities: Thursday, May 17th meeting with abutters from Trahan, Heath Brook and Ryan Schools; May 22nd at 6:00 p.m., community meeting scheduled at the Ryan School; and on Wednesday, June 20th at 6 p.m, a community meeting scheduled at the North Street School. Discussions will be on preparations to select a preferred solution from the current options which include a potential projects at 1) Trahan School for 265 student enrollment; 2) Heath Brook School for 525 student enrollment; or 3) Ryan School either a 525 or 790 student enrollment. The School Committee must give approval for the ESBC to look at configuration options. The ESBC established a Mission Statement and guiding principles. Mr. Francis reported the next ESBC meeting will be held on May 17th at TMHS. He stated that we are on track and everything has been submitted to MSBA on time.

Ms. Polimeno moved New Business #6, Discussion Regarding District-wide Grade 2, 3, and 4 Reconfiguration & Community Forum May 17, 2018, to see if Mr. Francis wanted to add anything to his report. Mr. Francis reported that on June 13th, the School Committee will be asked to vote to authorize the ESBC to review grade reconfiguration.

Tewksbury Education Foundation

Ms. Bennett reported the TEF held a meeting in April and elected new members, Martha Duffett, Vice-President, Sharon Pierce, Clerk, and existing members are Jenn Malizia, President, Tammie Ministeri, Treasurer. The Annual Spelling Bee will be held on June 11th and June 12th at the high school. The TEF will award \$500 scholarships next week to two TMHS seniors and the next meeting will be held on June 19th at 7:00 p.m, at TMHS. They will be discussing the new TEF fundraiser, Casino Night on November 16, 2018. Everyone is welcome to attend the meeting.

Ms. Regan presented a Next Generation MCAS update reporting that today the district completed grades 3-10 ELA and grade 5-8 Math. This week the district will administer grade 3 Math, grade 5 Science, and will complete grade 8 Science tomorrow. She reported the infrastructure is working, we are seeing some lag time online and one student was impacted at the Wynn School.. The issue was reported to the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE). Ms. Regan reported teachers are accessing Google Hangout so we know the ongoing updates. She reported that next week grade 4 and grade 10 Math will be administered and in June, grade 9 Science. She hopes that by June 13th to report a successful completion of the Next-Gen MCAS assessments.
