Ms. Polimeno invited the School Committee representatives for the Secretary Union to say a few words regarding negotiating the contract.

Mr. Francis moved the School Committee ratify a three year Labor Agreement between the Tewksbury School Committee and the AFSCME Council 93, Local 1703, effective July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2021, seconded by Mr. Sullivan. Mr. Cutelis disclosed he has a personal relationship with a member of the Secretaries Union and will abstain from the vote.

#### PRESENTATIONS

## 21st Century Community Learning Center Grant (21CCLC)

Ms. Gerrish and Ms. Basteri presented the 21st Century Community Learning Center Grant (21CCLC). Ms. Gerrish reported the district was awarded the 21CCLC for the 2018-2019 school year, in the amount of \$175,000 adding that the grant awarded is \$175,000 per year for three years. The grant will fund after-school and 2019 summer programs for Dewing students. Ms. Polimeno opened the topic to questions and comments from the School Committee. The Committee thanked Ms. Gerrish and Dr. Basteri for taking on the initiative and for procuring the grant.

Ms. Polimeno inquired if there was anyone in the audience wishing to speak on any item on the agenda. Seeing noone, Ms. Polimeno moved to the approval of meeting minutes.

#### SUPERINTENDENT REPORTS

## Mr. Malone Presented the Superintendent's Report:

Mr. Malone pointed out the Memorandum Between the Tewksbury Police Department and the Tewksbury Public Schools on School Resource Officers (SRO) on the Consent Agenda. The SRO memo was designed by the state relating the memo speaks to the relationship between the Tewksbury Public Schools, the Tewksbury Police Department and the Tewksbury Fire Department.

The district is hiring a night School Building Security Monitor at Tewksbury Memorial High School.

The district is looking at Community Services Extended Day and summer programming to determine whether it is an entity of the town or the district. Mr. Malone reported the summer program ended on a deficit this year relating we are looking at the components of the programming, rates and the value to the town. Mr. Malone requested the School Committee to entertain to a proposal seeking vendors interested in managing the Community Services programming.

Ms. Bennett moved, seconded by Mr. Cutelis, to approve a request to take a closer look at Community Services, especially the Before/After School program, and to put out bids to manage the Community Services programming. Roll Call Vote: Voting Yes: Mr. Sullivan, Ms. Bennett, Mr. Cutelis, Mr. Francis, and Ms. Polimeno. All Aye. No Opposed. Unanimous Vote. Motion carried 5-0.

Ms. Polimeno remarked that the district should continue effective communication with the community and distribute a letter notifying parents and staff members involved in the program within the next few days.

Mr. Malone reported on the successful opening of the schools, commenting on the hot conditions and environment for the students and the professionalism of our staff, and the support of parents. Mr. Malone reported the district is looking at the building structures and developing a plan to make sure our buildings are safe for children.

He reported the district is looking at the K-4 schools and ways to increase the use of fans, adding screens, cut in windows, and exhaust fans as a few options. The district has prioritized options to do the work as the weather gets cooler relating we are looking at long-term and ways to address the issue. He commented that the district is looking at any and all options.

Mr. Malone reported the town notified the district of a West Nile Virus concern although it didn't have a strong impact on the schools we looked at our options. He reported that Commissioner Jeffrey Riley, Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education, will visit the North Street School on October 1st, 9:00 a.m.-10:30 a.m. Mr. Malone reported that Zero Waste Day is scheduled on Saturday, September 22, 2018 at the Wynn Middle School from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. He reported the district has been asked to participate in an annual town event welcoming new residents to the Tewksbury. The event will be held at the Tewksbury Public Library on October 22nd. Mr. Malone announced that the Special Town Meeting will be held on October 2, 2018.

Ms. Regan reported on that on August 27, 2018 the district welcomed back 500 staff, recognizing new staff and staff with over 20 years of service to the district. She added that during the first two opening days, staff attended various sessions on legal updates, safety and security and the Elementary School Building Committee, the district strategy, goals and school improvement, special education, SEL training, and the district mapping project. Ms. Regan reported that during the summer over 69 staff members attended voluntary summer professional development and over 150 staff members participated in curriculum projects over the summer. Ms. Regan reported that she will present the Summer Reading at the next School Committee meeting.

Mr. Libby presented a transportation update to the School Committee pointing out that on the Consent Agenda is the big yellow bus matrix relating that there are three tiers; 1) TMHS/ Wynn Middle School, 2) Ryan School and 3) the K-4 Elementary Schools showing which busses are at which school and numbers on the buses. He reported the actual headcount will be conducted on next Monday and Tuesday. Mr. Libby thanked the vendors and the relationship with Tewksbury Transit relating they worked with him on the in-district van schedule as they know the students. He reported the district is in the second year of a three-year contract with Trombly Motor Coach for our out-of district students. Mr. Libby reported that Pride Star provides out-of-district transportation for students with medical needs having EMTs and paramedics on vans. Mr. Libby reported he will be providing the School Committee will the monthly budget report beginning next month. In response to a request from Ms. Bennett, Mr. Libby will provide the Committee with the information on the duration kids are on the buses.
