CALL TO ORDER

Ms. Polimeno called the October 17, 2018 Regular School Committee meeting to order at 6:31 p.m. Ms. Polimeno announced the School Committee will be convening an Executive Session to continue discussion relative to strategy with respect to collective bargaining or litigation.

Mr. Francis moved, seconded by Ms. Bennett, to enter into an Executive Session to continue discussion relative to strategy with respect to collective bargaining and/or litigation. The School Committee will reconvene in Open Session at 7:00 p.m.

Roll Call Vote - Voting Yes: Mr. Sullivan, Ms. Bennett, Mr. Francis, Mr. Cutelis and Ms. Polimeno. All Aye. No Opposed. Unanimous Vote. Motion carried 5-0.

At 7:00 p.m., Mr. Francis moved, seconded by Mr. Sullivan, to adjourn the Executive Session and reconvene the Regular School Committee meeting. All Aye. No Opposed. Unanimous Vote. Motion carried 5-0.

ANNOUNCEMENT

At 7:01 p.m., Ms. Polimeno announced that the October 17, 2018 Regular School Committee meeting will be televised and recorded. Under the Open Meeting Law, the public is permitted to make an audio or video recording of an open session at a public meeting. At this time, Ms. Polimeno asked that if anyone is recording tonight's meeting to please identify himself/herself. No one was present recording the meeting.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Ms. Polimeno invited the honored guests to lead the School Committee in the Pledge of Allegiance.

RECOGNITION

Tewksbury Memorial High School Students

Commended Students in the 2019 National Merit Scholarship Program

Mr. Malone reported that tonight we are honoring students with significant achievement on the Preliminary SATs. Mr. Malone introduced Aklilu Aron, Cameron Grace, Colton Rusch, and Emma White. Ms. Vogel was invited up to say a few words. She related that this is the first time we have had four Commended students which is a reflection on their class. On behalf of the School Committee, Ms. Bennett presented the students with a Resolution of Recognition.

National Hispanic Recognition Program 2018-19 National Hispanic Scholar

Mr. Malone invited Ms. Vogel and Ryan Smith to come forward. Mr. Malone reported that Ryan was selected as the recipient of the the 2018-19 National Hispanic Scholar due to his achievement on the Preliminary SATs. Ms. Vogel commented that Tewksbury Memorial High School is very proud of Ryan's accomplishment. On behalf of the School Committee, Mr. Francis presented Ryan with a Resolution of Recognition.

STUDENT REPRESENTATIVE

Grace Morris presented the Notes From Tewksbury Memorial High School:

Math Team - Tewksbury hosted the first Math Team meet of the year on October 4th. They had six other schools participate. They placed 4th in their division and came in 15th overall in the league of 43 teams. The remaining meets of the year will be away meets.

SADD - Red Ribbon Week starts on October 23rd to raise awareness for drug use and abuse.

DECA - The DECA Fashion Show will be held on November 15th. DECA members are working on getting students to sign up and the show is an open invitation to all members of the School Committee NHS has started their tutoring program and they are sending volunteers to set-up for Applefest on the Friday, October 26th.

Student Council has worked this week planning the Spirit Days for Homecoming week. They are sending volunteers to help out at the Heath Brook for a halloween party on Friday. They will begin leaf raking for the elderly in the town soon and the Regional Conference, NEMASC, will be held on November 13th. Best Buddies - The big Halloween Party is on October 30th, their Unified Basketball had their first game against Billerica last week, and will have a home game against Haverhill on Thursday.

Interact Class of 2019 has been planning Homecoming for the past few weeks, the dance will be on Friday. They will be selling tickets until tomorrow, and are already looking at a good turnout. They are working with the teachers to determine the nominees for the Homecoming king and queen.

PRESENTATIONS

MCAS Accountability Update - Brenda Regan, Assistant Superintendent

Ms. Regan reported that she and district administrators have attended multiple informational sessions on the new accountability changes. She presented the MCAS accountability update sharing information and shedding light on the new system. Mr. Malone thanked Ms. Regan for putting this information together. He reported that there was some concern with the information we were receiving on the accountability update as it changed as we attended presentations but there was some good information for the district to use relating the district is already targeting students that need assistance. At the recommendation of the Commissioner, data results should not be compared to previous years or to other districts.

Ms. Polimeno opened the meeting for questions and comments from the School Committee members. Ms. Polimeno gave congratulations to the Ryan School for meeting the targets and gave kudos to staff and the administration.

Mr. Malone introduced the district's Informational Technology team inviting them to come up for the presentation.

Information Technology Critical Needs Report - Jason Stamp, Director of S.T.E.M. / IT

Mr. Stamp addressed the School Committee thanking the School Committee for their ongoing support and the Town of Tewksbury for providing \$95,000 for technology infrastructure updates. Mr. Stamp thanked the district for adding additional administrators to the IT team. He introduced Cameron Carey the district's Cloud Administrator. Mr. Carey reported that he oversees applications and new technology and supports the digital learning technology. Mr. Stamp introduced Stephen Pifalo the district's Network Administrator. Mr. Pifalo reported since coming to Tewksbury he has help to evaluate the network and made upgrades where needed in the district. Mr. Stamp reported that our Systems Administrator, Brenden Le, was not able to attend tonight's meeting. He reported that relating that Mr. Le manages our servers and print services. Mr. Stamp reported that the IT department also has Tech Integration Coaches in the district helping the teachers know how to use the technology. There is a great collaboration between the Tech Department and the coaches. He reported the district has over 5,000 mobile devices and are integrating new devices e.g., the Clear Touch Board. Mr. Stamp presented a demonstration of a Clear Touch Board relating there are 18 in the district that teachers are piloting. Mr. Stamp reported that the IT department needs to look at the needs, improve speed on devices, and determine what needs to be done in order to support new devices. Mr. Stamp presented the IT Department's Critical Needs list to the School Committee.

Ms. Polimeno opened the meeting for questions and comments from the School Committee members.

CITIZEN'S FORUM

Ms. Polimeno inquired if there was anyone in the audience wishing to speak on any item on the agenda. Seeing no one, Ms. Polimeno moved to the Approval of Minutes.

SUPERINTENDENT AND ADMINISTRATOR REPORTS

Mr. Malone reported on the two new technology instructional positions which will allow the district to address instructional needs. Mr. Malone thanked the Town of Tewksbury for allocating money for the district to do a study on improving our school vestibules, he believes this money will have a significant impact on our school district for a long time.

Tewksbury School Committee Regular Meeting October 17, 2018

Mr. Malone reported he connected with Mr. Montuori regarding writing a request for a proposal for the Community Services Extended Day and Summer Program relating that the town is writing the RFP to be ready by November 1st.

Mr. Malone reported that he and Ms. Regan have met with principals on goal setting.

He reported the state will not be entertaining any snow-day waivers in the future. He reported that in preparation for snow days, the district would like to explore student engagement options and would report back to the School Committee.

Ms. Polimeno asked for a motion to give the district administrators the ability to explore different options for snow days.

Mr. Francis moved to allow the district administration team the ability to explore snow-day options, seconded by Mr. Cutelis. All Aye. No Opposed. Unanimous Vote. Motion carried 5-0.

Mr. Malone reported the Town-wide PAC met on October 15, 2018 at Tewksbury Memorial High School. He reported there was a presentation on school security and the Elementary School Building Project. He remarked that all parents are encouraged to be involved in the PACs and special education parents are welcome to reach out to the SEPAC is they want to get involved.

Mr. Malone reported he, Ms. Polimeno and Mr. Sullivan will attend the MCAS/MASS Annual Conference on November 7-10th.

He reported the district was invited to have a table at the Residents Welcome to Tewksbury event held on October 22nd at the Tewksbury Public Library. Mr. Malone thanked Alexis Bosworth and Mr. Francis for representing the district.

Ms. Regan reported the Ryan School held an iSTEM Open House on October 10th hosted by Ryan School teachers, Eileen Lindsey and Kim HIllson. She related that the Ryan School received a grant from the Corning Foundation giving the school the opportunity to furnish and equip the lab.

Ms. Regan reported that on October 10th, 414 10th and11th graders participated in the PSATs. She pointed out that the School Committee gave permission for the district to offer the PSATs during the school day adding that the School Committee funds the cost for the PSAT's. Ms. Regan reported that the 9th grade students participated in Native American Education on the culture and history of the Wamesit tribe presented by the Greater Lowell Tribal Council.

Ms. Polimeno requested that information on the Native American experience be shared with the media.
