# SUPERINTENDENT & STAFF REPORTS

Mr. Malone reported the Barnes and Noble fundraiser event will take place this Saturday, December 8th, recognizing the Tewksbury Education Foundation for creating events with a sense of community. He reported the Request For Proposals for the Extended Day and Summer Programming are due this Friday. He reported that he is working with Mr. Montuori, Town Manager, to develop a committee to review the RFP's. Mr. Malone reported the District Security Team met on November 28th to discuss current ALICE drills, adding that the police brought in search dogs into Tewksbury Memorial High School and the Wynn Middle School last week. This is something we typically do annually. He reported the district is working on developing an app which would give parents access to key information and the ability to report absences. Mr. Malone encouraged the community to attend the TMHS Theater production of *The Outsiders*, December 6-8, 2018.

Mr. Malone pointed out a donation on the Consent Agenda and recognized Josh Nichols, Pathfinder Project, for the donation of six (6) 3D printers to the district for the Robotics Club at Tewksbury Memorial High School. He reminded the community that December 6th is a half-day for students. Mr. Malone took a moment to recognize Grace Morris, the Student Council Representative to the School Committee, for receiving the John & Abigail Adams Scholarship tonight. #### Ms. Regan, Assistant Superintendent

Ms. Regan reported yesterday was the monthly Principal Curriculum Chat which focused on the need for district-wide improved math resources. With the inception of the new History and Social Studies curriculum frameworks the district will look to alter our course programming in grades 6-7 and 9-12. Ms. Regan reported the Town and the School Committee have allocated funding for the annual textbook budget.

She reported the technology infrastructure testing has begun for the Next Generation MCAS online testing in the spring. Ms. Regan reported tomorrow is an early release day for students but will be a workshop day for teachers. She added that on Thursday night, our Tewksbury Team of Administrators engaged in a Trivia Night Contest.

# David Libby, Business Manager

Mr. Libby presented the major projects update reporting on projects recently completed, in progress or to be completed.

Completed projects included vestibule and hallway improvements at the North Street School and roof repairs. The Maintenance staff replaced carpet at the Ryan and Center School, moved Smart Boards, improved the camera system at the high school, and completed landscape improvements at the Wynn. A Night Security Monitor has been hired for the high school and the tree was removed at end of the high school driveway. Electrical upgrades are underway at the Ryan and Wynn and heating upgrades are underway at the Dewing and Heath Brook, and heat shades are being installed in the elementary schools. He reported the district has completed interviews for the position of Assistant Maintenance Foreman. Mr. Libby reported on the projects to be completed relating there will be improvements in the North Street common area, painting, replace lights, and bulletin boards. The high school is close to getting windows with intruder resistance film and vestibule improvement projects at the other schools. Mr. Libby thanked Mr. Marchand and the staff for doing a great job. Mr. Libby opened for questions and/or comments from the Committee.
