CALL TO ORDER

At 7:15 p.m., Mr. Francis called the April 10, 2019 Regular School Committee meeting to order.

Mr. Francis announced that the April 10, 2019 Regular School Committee Meeting will be televised and recorded. Under the Open Meeting Law, the public is permitted to make an audio or video recording of an open session at a public meeting. At this time, Mr. Francis asked that if anyone is recording tonight's meeting to please identify himself/herself. Seeing none Mr. Francis invited Mr. Malone to introduce the volunteers.

RECOGNITION

<u>District-wide Volunteers/Senior Tax Program Participants</u> (See attached list)

Mr. Malone recognized the importance of the school volunteers introducing the volunteers participating in the Senior Tax Program relating that volunteers are the backbone of the district. He thanked the Town of Tewksbury for continuing the program.

SUPERINTENDENT REPORTS

Mr. Malone reported that he hopes everyone is supporting Autism Awareness month. The district is working on an app for the district's website. Mr. Malone thanked Representative Dave Robertson for supporting and working with him on events in support of school funding. He reported the district is working forward on upgrades to school security, installing a new alarm system at the Center School, a video camera overhaul at the Wynn School, and seeking a quote to overhaul and institute security cameras in the Dewing School, Ryan School, and Heath Brook. Mr. Stamp has written a grant for over \$100,000 to support the camera systems. Mr. Malone offered congratulations to those that attended the Town-wide PAC meeting on Monday night relating that they were trained on the Stop the Bleed program adding that school administrators and nurses have also been trained as well as he and Mr. Regan.

Mr. Malone reported on upcoming events relating that the Junior Prom will be held tomorrow evening at Tewksbury Memorial High School and the TMHS Theater Company are presenting *Godspell*, April 25th through April 27th. Mr. Malone reminded the school community that AlphaBest, the new company that will be coming in to work on the summer program and Extended-day program, have messaged out the information to parents/guardians.

Ms. Regan reported that March 26th and 27th, at TMHS, the 10th graders will be taking the Next-Generation ELA MCAS online relating this is the first time for 10th graders to take that test online. She reported the district received new news from the Commissioner regarding an issue submitted by administrators about reactions from students regarding one of the essay questions on the 10th grade ELA MCAS. The issue is being reviewed, the results will not be used from this particular question, and adding that the test will still count. Ms. Regan reported that Science Night at the Trahan School is being held tonight and the North Street School is hosting the Wax Museum this week. May 1st is Day on the Hill, which is an advocacy day hosted by the MASC. School Committee members and students will be attending and will able to meet with state Legislatures. She reported the Girls Ice Hockey, State Champions, will be recognized at the Day on the Hill event. Ms. Regan reported grades 5-12 are exploring new math resources and history, grades 5-8, are researching new resources. Ms. Regan reported the School Committee will be given preliminary information at the May 15th meeting, textbooks will be on display in the Curriculum Office and online resources are also available. The items will be on the June 12th meeting for the consideration of the School Committee. She reported that Friday, April 12th is a half-day, early release day for students and kicks off April vacation. Ms. Regan added that April 12th is report card day.

Mr. Malone reported on an item Mr. Libby gave him that the district has received our audit foom the end of year financial report which ended on June 30 2018 and received on February 28 2019. It is a one page report with no findings.
