CALL TO ORDER

Mr. Sullivan called the May 20, 2020, Regular School Committee meeting to order at 6:02 p.m.

Mr. Sullivan, School Committee Chairman, confirmed that all members of the School Committee and persons on the agenda are present and give consent to record the meeting.

Roll Call Vote - Voting Yes: Ms. Demos, Mr. Cutelis, Mr. Stadtman, Mr. Wilson, Mr. Sullivan, Mr. Malone, Ms. Regan, Mr. Libby, Ms. Vogel, Ms. Schille, Ms. Cunningham, and Ms. Taggart. Unanimous Vote. Motion carried 12-0.

Mr. Sullivan read the Governor's Order for conducting a remote meeting and the Tewksbury School Committee Ground Rules. The Chair stated that this meeting will be recorded and viewed live. Ms. Demos moved to approve the payroll period ending April 30, 2020, to be approved and certified in the amount and categories as shown (\$1,302,416.85), seconded by Mr. Wilson.

Roll Call Vote - Voting Yes: Mr. Wilson, Mr. Stadtman, Mr. Cutelis, Ms. Demos, and Mr. Sullivan. Unanimous Vote. Motion carried 5-0.

Ms. Demos moved to approve the payroll period ending May 14, 2020, to be approved and certified in the amount and categories as shown (\$1,304,855.38), seconded by Mr. Cutelis.

Roll Call Vote - Voting Yes: Mr. Wilson, Mr. Stadtman, Mr. Cutelis, Ms. Demos, and Mr. Sullivan. Unanimous Vote. Motion carried 5-0.

SUPERINTENDENT REPORTS

Mr. Malone presented an update on the News Cares Act, a federal government program in which the state will provide elementary and secondary schools funding due to Covid-19. He reported that the district is working on the grant in hopes of completing it by late June. Mr. Malone presented an update on Covid-19 relating that we are in Phase 3 with schools closed and that Phase 4 is the opening of schools. He reported that details are not forthcoming from the state but that the district is moving forward. He added that summer camps like AlphaBEST, Special Education programs, or Credit Recover may not happen.

Mr. Malone offered congratulations to Mr. Libby, TPS Business Manager, for a successful FY19 End of Year report, reporting that the audit had no findings and no matters of interest. Mr. Malone offered *Hats Off!* to Mr. Libby and the Business Office staff. He reported that Mr. Libby is looking into refunding parking fees at high school. Mr. Malone offered congratulations to Ms. Vogel as she accepted the position of Superintendent of Lynnfield Public Schools. He reported a survey was conducted to determine the characteristics of a new leader and due to the current pandemic situation, the district will seek an Interim Principal for the high school. He reported the hope is to have a recommendation by the next School Committee meeting on June 10th and the candidate to be in place by July 1st. Mr. Malone reported the construction fence has begun to go up between the Ryan School and the Center School. He reported that the district has received a donation of 1,000 masks from Mr. Richard Landoli. Mr. Malone presented current and upcoming events:

May 1st - Governor's Luncheon/Hero Day to honor Food Services Staff
May 6th-12th - National School Nurse Week
May 4th-8th - Teacher and Principal Appreciation Week
May 22nd - Last day to submit artwork for the TPS Virtual Art Show
May 26th - Teachers will enter schools to pick up there belongs and bag up student belongings.

Mr. Malone addressed the Chair stating that last month the Committee approved the calendar. He presented a revised calendar requesting the Committee to take into consideration to adjust the first day of school from Wednesday September 2, 2020 to Monday, August 31, 2020. Mr. Malone reported that the district continued remote learning during April vacation, as a result the last day of school is June 15th He added that Labor Day is late this year making a lot of time between the end of school and the beginning of the next year. He reported the district surveyed parents and 60% were in favor of an early start. Mr. Sullivan opened up for questions and/or comments from the School Committee.

In response to a question from Ms. Demos, Mr. Malone reported that parents and teachers are in favor of an earlier start date of August 31st. He reported that the opening day and the two Professional Development days for teachers would be on August 26th and August 27th with a non-work day on August 28th. Mr. Cutelis commented that if parents and teachers want it, it is a good idea. Mr. Wilson concurred with Mr. Cutelis. Mr. Malone recommend for the Committee to vote on the start date of school.

Mr. Stadtman moved, seconded by Mr. Wilson, to move the first day of school for students from September 2, 2020 to August 31, 2020.

Roll Call Vote - Voting Yes: Mr. Wilson, Mr. Stadtman, Mr. Cutelis, Ms. Demos, and Mr. Sullivan. Unanimous Vote.
Motion carried 5-0.

In light of the informative report from Mr. Malon, Mr. Sullivan opened for further questions and/or comments from the School Committee. There were no comments from the Committee. Mr. Sullivan thanked Mr. Malone, the TPS staff, and the town for getting the School Committee meetings live and online.

Mr. Malone reported there is another element to the calendar relating that the School Committee needs to vote on the first two days of school for teachers and staff which would will be August 26th and August 27th as professional development days.

Mr. Malone recommends the School Committee vote to move the first day for teachers and staff from August 31, 2020 and September 1, 2020 to August 26th and August 27th. Mr. Sullivan asked if the Committee had any questions. Seeing none, Mr. Sullivan asked for a motion from the Committee.

Mr. Wilson moved to establish the start day for teachers and staff as August 26, 2020 (PD day) and August 27, 2020 (PD day). Ms. Demos seconded.

Roll Call Vote - Voting Yes: Mr. Wilson, Mr. Stadtman, Mr. Cutelis, Ms. Demos, and Mr. Sullivan. Unanimous Vote.
Motion carried 5-0.

Ms. Theriault-Regan, Assistant Superintendent's Report

Ms. Regan pointed out the following updates on the Consent Agenda: 2020-2021 Chain of Communication, which has minimal changes, the Quarter 3 Report Cards, and Special Education Progress reports. The Committee members thanked Ms. Regan for the time and effort put into the report cards.

Mr. Libby, Business Manager Report

Mr. Libby reported on another part of the Cares Act. He reported on the USDA Federal Farmers to Families Food Box Program which helps agricultural communities hit hard by restaurants being closed. The Governor is helping to get the food in other hands.

As a result, the district received 56 boxes of mixed produce for our lunch Bag and Grab Program. We have a cooperative effort between TPS Maintenance and Custodial staff and Food & Nutrition Services to help provide the food to people in the community. We are expected to receive deliveries from the USDA in May and June. The Committee members thanked Mr. Libby.

There were no questions from the Committee. Mr. Sullivan commented on an item on the agenda, acknowledging and thanking the Ryan PAC for the generous donation of \$10,000 for the Ryan Court Yard project. Mr. Sullivan asked for motion to approve the Consent Agenda.

Ms. Demos moved, seconded by Mr. Wilson, to approve the Consent Agenda as presented.

SCHOOL COMMITTEE REPORTS

Elementary School Building Committee (ESBC)

Mr. Cutelis reported the project is moving along. Consigli Construction has erected a fence around the perimeter of the project. We have received approval from the Planning Board and the Conservation Commission. Consigli has developed a Covid-19 employee working plan to make sure everyone is safe.

Tewksbury Education Foundation

Ms. Demos had no update.

Tewksbury SEPAC

Mr. Sullivan reported that SEPAC has been meeting with him and the administration over the past five weeks. They have been a valuable resource with remote learning and special education services. They held their first virtual meeting last Wednesday. SEPAC will be holding a virtual public meeting on May 28th for election of officers.

Wellness Advisory Committee

Mr. Stadtman had no update.

POLICY CHANGES, PROPOSALS, AND ADOPTION

Ms. Demos reported the following policies are presented on the second and final reading and will be voted on at the next School Committee meeting. JB -Equal Educational Opportunities; JBB -Educational Equity; JFABD -Homeless Students: Enrollment Rights and Services; JFABE -Educational Opportunities for Military; JFABF -Educational Opportunities for Children in Foster Care

Mr. Sullivan asked Mr. Malone to discuss the June 29th date regarding the phases to open schools. Mr. Malone commented that according to the Governor's Order, there is to be no in-person instruction through June 29th, he is not sure what will happen after June 29th. He commented that the Governor did not talk about schools in his plan.

OLD BUSINESS

FY21 Budget Review and Approval

Mr. Malone provided a prelude to Mr. Libby's budget review. He reported we are confident with the FY21 budget relating that the district is working hard within the confines of the FY20 budget and what changes and possibilities we may have to make for staff and students due to the pandemic.

Mr. Libby presented the Tewksbury Public Schools recommended FY21 Budget reporting that the salaries, operating costs and Capital Outlay budgets represent a 2.94% increase in our request for FY21 over FY20 and other costs associated with the school department get us to a 2.03% increase over the FY20 budget. Of our budget, 70% is in salaries, our operating budget is 28% of the schools' budget, and the Capital Outlay budget is 2%. Mr. Libby highlighted a few of the changes to the budget reporting that on a personnel perspective, It includes funding for an additional School Resource Officer (SRO) at the elementary level, in the area of technology, it includes funding for device maintenance and monitoring, as well as new STEM and Maker Spaces for all school buildings. Mr. Libby mentioned that there were a few pages of line items missing from the presentation and he will email the information to the Committee and post on the website. Mr. Libby opened for questions from the School Committee.

Ms. Demos thanked Mr. Libby for all the hard work and had no questions at this time. In response to a question from Mr. Stadtman, Mr. Libby reported that since the last budget presentation there was a slight increase in transportation cost and tuition posted by the Valley Collaborative. He mentioned that the district realized some savings due to retirements and resignations and related that the SRO position was in the budget from the start. Mr. Malone responded to a question from Mr. Stadtman as to how it may impact our budget if the Collaborative increases tuition in the fall. He related that we do not have a specific indication that there will be an impact on the FY20 budget and if there is due to the many unknowns, we would have to look at how we can address it in the FY21 budget. The School Committee thanked Mr. Libby for the presentation.

Mr. Cutelis moved to approve the FY21 School Budget in the amount of \$61,187,066. Seconded by Mr. Wilson.

Roll Call Vote – Mr. Wilson (Yes); Mr. Stadtman (No); Mr. Cutelis (Yes); Ms. Demos (Yes); Mr. Sullivan (Yes). Motion carried 4-1.

Remote Learning Plan Update and Parent Survey Feedback

Ms. Regan presented an update on the Remote Learning Plan, the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education guidelines, and school closure phases. She presented the results of a parent survey on the Remote Learning Plan reporting the district received a 25% return on the survey with 546 families participating out of approximately 2,200 families. Ms. Regan opened for questions from the School Committee. In response to a question from Ms. Demos, Ms. Regan reported that the district is considering leaving devices loaned to students in the hands of students for summer remote learning. She added that the district will survey families and will communicate in the next district newsletter what is best. The Committee thanked Ms. Regan for the presentation. Mr. Sullivan thanked parents for participating as it helped the district.

NEW BUSINESS

Acceptable Use Policy

Ms. Regan requested to move The Acceptable Use Policy forward. She pointed out the changes in the AUP. Mr. Sullivan opened for questions and comments from the Committee. There were no questions or comments.

Ms. Demos moved to approve the Acceptable Use Policy, seconded by Mr. Stadtman.

Roll Call Vote - Voting Yes: Mr. Wilson, Mr. Stadtman, Mr. Cutelis, Ms. Demos, and Mr. Sullivan. Unanimous Vote. Motion carried 5-0.
