CALL TO ORDER

Mr. Sullivan called the September 16, 2020, Regular School Committee meeting to order at 5:30 p.m.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

At 5:31 p.m., Mr. Sullivan announced that the School Committee will be going into an Executive Session to continue discussion relative to collective bargaining with employee groups and the strategy to be followed and/or continued ongoing litigation. Mr. Cutelis moved to enter into the Executive Session, seconded by Mr. Wilson. The School Committee will reconvene in Open Session following the Executive Session.

Roll Call Vote: Voting Yes: Mr. Wilson, Mr. Stadtman, Mr. Cutelis, and Mr. Sullivan. Unanimous Vote. Motion carried 4-0.

ADJOURNMENT & RECONVENE REGULAR MEETING

At 5:50 p.m., Mr. Sullivan adjourned the September 16, 2020 Executive Session and reconvened the Regular School Committee meeting with a motion from Mr. Cutelis, seconded by Mr. Wilson.

Roll Call Vote: Voting Yes: Mr. Wilson, Mr. Stadtman, Mr. Cutelis, and Mr. Sullivan. Unanimous Vote. Motion carried 4-0.

At 6:00 p.m. Mr. Sullivan reconvened the Regular School Committee meeting calling for a Moment of Silence for Elaine Fiske. He remarked that Mrs. Fiske was a former teacher at the Heath Brook School. A scholarship in her memory has been established, to donate, please contact Pat Whitehouse at Tewksbury Memorial High School.

Mr. Sullivan read the Governor's Order for conducting a remote meeting and the Tewksbury School Committee ground rules. The Chair stated that this meeting will be recorded and viewed live. SUPERINTENDENT & STAFF REPORTS

Mr. Malone, Superintendent

Mr. Malone asked the Committee to move item C, Old Business, 2021 Wynn Middle School Washington, D.C. trip up on the agenda and item A, New Business, Remote Learning Academy participation in athletics and co-curricular activities.

Mr. Cutelis motioned, seconded by Mr. Wilson, to take out of order, Old Business C and New Business A.

Roll Call Vote - Voting Yes: Mr. Wilson, Mr. Stadtman, Mr. Cutelis, and Mr. Sullivan. Unanimous Vote. Motion carried 4-0.

2021 Wynn Middle School Washington D.C., Trip

Mr. Weir recapped that the trip was brought to the School Committee a month ago, approving for Mr. Gillespie to move forward with planning the trip to D.C. However, due to current state and national restrictions due to the pandemic, the Wynn School will not move forward with the trip. Mr. Malone recommended that the Committee vote not to move forward with the trip.

At the recommendation of Superintendent Malone, Mr. Wilson moved to postpone the Washington, D.C., trip for the 2020-2021 school year, seconded by Mr. Cutelis.

Roll Call Vote - Voting Yes: Mr. Wilson, Mr. Stadtman, Mr. Cutelis, and Mr. Sullivan. Unanimous Vote. Motion carried 4-0.

Remote Learning Academy Students Participation in Athletics and Co-Curricular Activities

Mr. Malone reported that there has been discussion at the state level regarding students that choose a Remote Learning Academy (RLA) in districts participating in a Hybrid Model, and whether they may participate in athletics and/or co-curriculum activities. He reported that the district takes attendance into consideration for students to be eligible for extra-curricular activities. Students in the Remote Learning Academy are graded and attendance is taken. Mr. Malone recommends the Committee to consider that the RLA students participate in co-curricular activities and athletics.

Mr. Drouin addressed the Committee stating that he and Principal Bernard support the Superintendent's recommendation.

Mr. Sullivan opened for comments and questions from the School Committee.

Mr. Wilson moved to allow students in the Remote Learning Academy to participate in all extra-curricular and athletic activities for the school year 2020-2021, while the district is in the Hybrid Model.

Roll Call Vote - Voting Yes: Mr. Wilson, Mr. Stadtman, Mr. Cutelis, and Mr. Sullivan. Unanimous Vote. Motion carried 4-0.

Mr. Sullivan checked in with Courtney Coviello to see if there are any callers; there were no callers.

Mr. Malone reported today is the opening day for students returning to school. The district is in the Hybrid Model, today being a full-remote day and tomorrow will be an in-person. Mr. Malone reported the district has finalized a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Tewksbury Teachers Association. He reported on AlphaBEST's before and after school programming and the Community Services preschool programming. He reported the district is working with Tewksbury Transit to transport kids to the after school program. Mr. Malone reported we are working with staff and the TTA to insure all students participating in the Remote Learning Academy (RLA) will be taught by TPS teachers. He presented an update on maintenance and custodial cleaning and disinfecting throughout the district. The district is working with the Tewksbury Fire Department conducting fire drills and the Tewksbury Department of Health and TPS Lead Nurse to make sure children receive a flu shot. Mr. Malone offered a thank you to Mr. Montuori for the grant for lighting at schools and other opportunities.

Mr. Sullivan opened for comments and questions from the School Committee. The Committee offered thanks to Mr. Malone, Ms. Regan and Mr. Libby for all their work during the reopening of schools.

Ms. Theriault-Regan, Assistant Superintendent's Report

Ms. Regan announced that recent communications that were sent home may be found on the district website. She presented screen shots from the district website reminding parents about the expectations of COVID-19 screening at home, the importance of doing wellness checks, and information on mask guidance, adding that students will receive lanyards to hold their mask. Ms. Regan pointed out the Digital Resources & Supports on the website and information on the Grab 'n Go Lunch program and curbside pick-up. She reported the district's website event calendar has been updated to include the cohort schedules. She concluded by reminding students that it is not too late to complete your summer reading.

Mr. Libby, Business Manager

Mr. Libby presented a Transportation Department update to the Committee relating there are new challenges with the 25 student capacity limitations. He reported that Tewksbury Transportation has helped with assignment of seats. Mr. Libby addressed the community stating that the district has capacity on the busses to handle students in most situations asking families to be patient while we make the changes. Mr. Libby reported that drivers have been timing routes, completing dry runs, and participating in driver training safety and protocols. Mr. Libby offered thanks to Tewksbury Transit, Trombly, and Pride Star, as well as the Central Office staff for working together for the start-up of school.

Mr. Sullivan opened for comments and questions from the School Committee. The Committee thanked Mr. Libby for all he has done.
