CALL TO ORDER

Mr. Sullivan called the March 9, 2022, Regular School Committee meeting to order at 5:34 p.m.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

Mr. Sullivan entertained a motion to convene an Executive Session to review and approve the Executive Session minutes and to discuss strategy with respect to collective bargaining with employee groups and/or litigation or discussion of personnel matters. The Committee will also discuss Collective Bargaining with Teamsters (Nurses) regarding ratification of the Contract.

Ms. Garabedian moved, seconded by Mr. Stadtman, to enter into the Executive Session to review and approve the Executive Session minutes and to discuss strategy with respect to collective bargaining with employee groups and/or litigation or discussion of personnel matters. The Committee will discuss Collective Bargaining with Teamsters (Nurses) regarding ratification on the School Committee side of the Nurses contract. The Committee will return in open session.

Roll Call Vote - Voting Yes: Mr. Parsons, Ms. Garabedian, Mr. Stadtman, and Mr. Sullivan. All Aye. Unanimous vote. Motion carried 4-0. Ms. Demos arrived at 5:37 p.m.

At 6:00 p.m., Mr. Sullivan entertained a motion to adjourn the March 9, 2022 Executive Session. Ms. Demos moved, seconded by Mr. Stadtman. The Committee will reconvene in open session.

Roll Call Vote - Voting Yes: Mr. Parsons, Ms. Garabedian, Ms. Demos, Mr. Stadtman, and Mr. Sullivan. All Aye. Unanimous vote. Motion carried 5-0.

PUBLIC HEARING ON THE BUDGET

Mr. Sullivan reconvened the March 9, 2022 Regular School Committee meeting and opened the Public Hearing on the Budget at 6:03 pm.

Mr. Libby addressed the School Committee welcoming everyone to the third presentation of the FY23 Public Hearing on the budget reporting that the district keeps in mind the District Strategy and Theory of Action as we go through the budget process. He reported that the budget consists of four major parts: Salary, Operating accounts, and Capital Outlay, which are managed by the schools, and Fixed Costs which are managed by and shared with the town.

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Mr. Libby pointed out that the areas of focus relating that the information has been updated to include the COVID grant spending through the end of February. A 2.12% increase is requested due in part to the Shawsheen Tech assessments. He is working with the Town Manager to develop a plan to cover recent resignations, retirements, replacements, and a shift of one nurse to the ESSER III grant. The remaining balance will come from the town budget. The FY23 School Budget is \$70,685,561.00. Mr. Libby presented the next steps in the budget process.

Mr. Sullivan reported that as a matter of interest, the School Committee and the Nurses have an Agreement, the Nurses have ratified their contract.

Mr. Libby responded to questions and comments from the School Committee members.

RECONVENE REGULAR MEETING

At 6:34 p.m., Mr. Sullivan closed the Public Hearing on the Budget. Ms. Demos moved, seconded by Mr. Stadtman to adjourn the Public Hearing and reconvene the Regular School Committee meeting. All Aye. Unanimous Vote. Motion carried 5-0.

ANNOUNCEMENT

Mr. Sullivan reported the March 9, 2022 Regular School Committee meeting will be televised and recorded and may be viewed live on Comcast Channel 22 and Verizon Channel 34 or YouTube.com/TewksburyTV. Under the Open Meeting Law, the public is permitted to make an audio or video recording of an open session at a public meeting. Mr. Sullivan inquired if anyone in the audience was recording tonight's meeting or taking any video or audio recording of the meeting. Seeing no one, Mr. Sullivan moved onto the next order of business.

Jack Stadtman led the Committee in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Ms. Regan introduced Mr. George Paul and invited Dr. Basteri to say a few words. On behalf of the School Committee, Ms. Demos read and presented Mr. Paul with a Resolution of Recognition. Mr. Paul thanked the Committee members and the community relating that he is like crabgrass; we cannot get rid of him. He would not have been here this long if he did not enjoy the town and the schools. Mr. Sullivan thanked Mr. Paul and wished him the best of luck.

STUDENT REPRESENTATIVE

Notes From Tewksbury Memorial High School

Jack Stadtman presented the notes from Tewksbury Memorial High School.

PRESENTATIONS

TPD Comfort Dog Update - Officer Waffles and Officer Hanley

Ms. Regan introduced Tewksbury Police Officer Hanley and the TPD comfort dog, Officer Waffles. Officer Hanley presented an update relative to the training and duties of Officer Waffles. Officer Waffles walked about the room greeting the Committee members and the audience.

Officer Hanley responded to questions and comments from the School Committee members.

S.T.E.M. Updates

Mr. Stamp addressed the Committee on the state of technology in the Tewksbury Public Schools. He reported on the types of technology, the digital resources, and the support staff to support teachers and students. This year the Tech department inventoried the digital resources protocols and procedures. He acknowledged the support of the School Committee and introduced the District's three Math Coaches, Sarah Yore, Laura Szum, and Erin Swanson. The Math Coaches presented the K-4 Math curriculum and implementation plan and goals and the tasks completed this year.

The Coaches and Mr. Stamp responded to questions from the School Committee. Mr. Sullivan thanked Mr. Stamp, Ms. Yore, Ms. Swanson, and Ms. Szum for the presentation.

ELA Updates for Elementary Schools

Ms. Regan introduced Principal Cenanovic to present the K-6 ELA resources update. Ms. Cenanovic addressed the School Committee presenting the TPS K-6 literacy instructional materials adoption update. She reported that the district is adopting new instructional materials for K-6 Literacy in the district and next year they will participate in a pilot ELA program. Ms. Cenanovic went through the adoption timeline process and reported that the district will extend *Journeys* for the 2022-2023 school year and continue to research and pilot the new program.

In June of 2022, we will identify the K-6 teacher volunteers to pilot the program relating that it will be piloted from September 2022 until May 2023. We will schedule stakeholder engagement sessions and next spring we will compare and analyze data and feedback and bring a recommendation to the School Committee. The district will offer Professional Development for the teachers and a full implementation of the new program for the 2023-2024 school year.

Ms. Cenanovic responded to questions and comments from the School Committee members. The Committee thanked Ms. Cenanovic for her presentation. In response to a suggestion from Ms. Demos regarding the procurement timeline, Ms. Cenanovic responded that the timeline will be fluid.

CITIIZEN'S FORUM

Mr. Sullivan asked if there was anyone in the audience that wanted to speak on anything on the agenda, and if so, to please state your name, address, and the specific agenda item that you would like to speak to this evening. Seeing no one, Mr. Sullivan moved on to approval of the Minutes.

Ms. Garabedian moved, seconded by Ms. Demos, to approve the February 9, 2022, Regular School Committee meeting minutes. All Aye. Motion carried 4-0-1. Mr. Stadtman Abstained.

Ms. Garabedian moved, seconded by Ms. Demos, to approve the February 22, 2022, Special School Committee meeting minutes. All Aye. Motion carried 5-0.

SUBMISSION OF PAYMENT OF BILLS (File)

Ms. Garabedian moved to Table the payroll period ending February 17, 2022, in order to verify the payroll amount. The Committee will vote on the agenda item at the next School Committee meeting.

Ms. Garabedian moved to approve the payroll period ending, March 3, 2022, to be approved and certified in the amount and categories as shown \$1,537,958.42, seconded by Ms. Demos. All Aye. Unanimous Vote. Motion carried 5-0.

SUPERINTENDENT & STAFF REPORTS

Ms. Regan, Superintendent

Ms. Regan reported that the Center School Directory has been updated and can be found on the consent agenda and the district website. March 28th signifies the date that masks became optional at TPS; parents may still receive the test kits. Parent/ Teacher conferences will be held in March and April; parents will have the option for a virtual or an in-person conference. The TMHS Social Host Laws live stream presentation was rescheduled to March 23rd. She reported that the District received approval of the ESSER III grant (\$2.77 million dollars) and approval of the FY22 Accelerated Literacy Learning Grant in the amount of \$200,000.00.

Ms. Regan presented the following updates:

- Parents mandated state testing completed for Access testing.
- The week of March 21st kicks off the TMHS MCAS assessment schedule.
- TMHS Principal Bernard and our Athletic Director and Billerica Public Schools' Principal and Athletic Director
 met with students on March 1st and March 4th at Billerica High School to establish short and long term goals to
 maintain relationships between the school. Students are going to use their experience to be role models. We
 are proud of the willingness of the students coming together. Students learned that they can still have positive
 relationships.
- TMHS Boys Hockey Team defeated Longmeadow; they move to the State Quarter Finals on Friday; and tickets are on sale.
- 233 Kindergartener appointments are scheduled to register for school next year. TPS in-line with our current staffing.

Ms. Regan presented the Collective Bargaining update:

- The School Committee voted on and signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the School Nurses.
- We have been attending ongoing meetings with the Custodians and the Secretaries and are in a good place with the draft MOU.
- On Friday, the Tewksbury Teachers Association (TTA) and the Education Support Personnel (ESP) will be ratifying their contracts.

Ms. Regan responded to questions and comments from the School Committee. In response to a question from Mr. Sullivan, Ms. Regan reported that the TMHS students and the Billerica High School students will continue to meet and work out the goals. They are collaborating and the students have created a list of priorities they would like to put together.
