**CALL TO ORDER**

Ms. Garabedian called the June 8, 2022 Regular School Committee meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

## **STUDENT REPRESENTATIVE REPORT**

**Notes from Tewksbury Memorial High School:** Rania Elouahi, Student Council representative to the School Committee, introduced herself. Currently, Rania is a freshman at TMHS, a member of the International Club, Student Council, and track team.

### **Ms. Elouahi presented the notes from Tewksbury Memorial High School:**

Since we're nearing the end of the school year, there are many activities, as the last few weeks of school are always jam-packed and full of fun activities along with more stressful ones.

- In March, the Student Council elected new members to be part of the E-Board. They have been getting used to their new roles and planned several events for the remainder of the year.
- Student Council is planning the club fair and student orientation for incoming freshmen. They have also proposed a Culture Day.
- TMHS Theater Company put on an astonishing performance of *Mamma Mia* and announced their next shows, *Girls* (in the fall), *A Grand Night for Singing* (in the winter), and *Beauty and the Beast* (in the spring).
- Week of June 13th is finals week. Additionally, on June 7th and June 8th, freshmen took the MCAS biology assessment.
- Senior Projects began on April 6th and were displayed on June 3rd, which was the last day for seniors.
- June 3rd, the childcare preschool center at TMHS had a move-up day, where the children graduated.
- The senior prom was held at the Danversport Yacht Club on June 6th and there will be a senior cruise along with a senior breakfast soon.
- We are all looking forward to summer vacation and a great upcoming school year!

## **PRESENTATIONS**

### **2022 Senior Projects**

Superintendent Regan introduced TMHS Assistant Principal, Michelle Dick and Brian Gouthro, to present an update on the Senior Project.

Ms. Dick reported that the project allows students to take the skills they have learned during their high school career and put those skills to use in the community during their last quarter of high school. Students did research projects, worked in the community in nursing, trades, law firms and the Tewksbury Police Department. She reported that the Senior Project is available to every senior at the high school, relating that this year there were 197 participants out of 226 seniors; this is the highest level of participation yet. Ms. Dick gave *kudos* to Brian Gouthro for coordinating with the school administrators and students to make the project work; he made kids accountable and helped them get sponsors. Mr. Gouthro pointed out three examples of the research projects and reported that the projects are a testament to the diverse interest of the students at the high school.

Ms. Garabedian entertained comments and questions from the School Committee members.

### **Tewksbury SEPAC End-of-Year Review**

On behalf of the Tewksbury Special Education Parent Advisory Committee (SEPAC) Dina Mancini and Maureen Castiglione presented the Tewksbury SEPAC end-of-year review, reporting on the events they hosted during the 2021-2022 school year.

The School Committee thanked them for the informative presentation from the SEPAC.

### **TPS Food & Nutrition Services Update**

Deb Mugford, Director of the Food and Nutrition Services Department (F&NS), presented an end-of-year review for the Food & Nutrition Services. She reported that the FN&S is a self-supporting department. Since 2019 the free and reduced lunch program has increased by 30%.

The department has felt the impact of the supply chain issues and increases in prices. She reported on current legislative matters which may have an impact on the lunch and breakfast program, the department's accomplishments and goals, and announced that the Food Services department had two successful reviews from the MA Department of Elementary and Secondary Education: Procurement Review and the Comprehensive Administration Review. Ms. Mugford responded to questions and comments from the School Committee.

### **Corning Foundation & S.T.E.A.M. Labs**

Dewing Principal Terry Gerrish, Assistant Principal Alexis Bosworth, elementary S.T.E.A.M. Teacher Charity Legvold, and from the Corning Foundation, Brent Lanterman (Dewing parent) and Syliva Duress, addressed the School Committee presenting an update on the S.T.E.A.M. labs at the Tewksbury Public Schools. The Corning Foundation has partnered with the Tewksbury Public Schools on S.T.E.A.M. projects to support the community. The Dewing School received a \$15,000 grant from the Corning Foundation. Ms. Legvold has been instrumental in setting-up the labs relating that the school has individual units in science for K-2 with alignment to S.T.E.A.M. Corning helped to start a hydroponic indoor farm at the Dewing School. The Corning Foundation has secured additional funding for the Tewksbury schools.

Ms. Garabedian opened for questions and comments from the School Committee.

### **CITIZEN'S FORUM**

Ms. Garabedian asked if there was anyone in the audience that wanted to speak on anything on the agenda, and if so, to please state their name, address, and the specific agenda item that they would like to speak to this evening. Not seeing anyone, she moved on to approval of the minutes.

### **SUPERINTENDENT & STAFF REPORTS**

#### **Ms. Regan, Superintendent**

Ms. Regan presented an update on the administrative changes in the district for the 2022-2023 school year: Mr. Harding will be the 2022-2023 principal at the Center Elementary School, Ms. Gerrish is the new principal at the Heath Brook School, Ms. Bosworth will be staying at the Dewing School, and Ms. DeMorais will be leaving her position at the North Street School.

The district has posted an opening for an assistant principal at the North Street School to work jointly with Mr. Harding adding that he will be the overseer of both the North Street and Trahan schools.

The Assistant Superintendent hiring will be completed next week; Ms. Regan will present an update at the July School Committee meeting. She reported that on May 18th, 19 students were recognized for their Biliteracy achievement. May 26th, she attended the Scholarship Awards Night at the high school stating that through the generosity of donors, there was \$170,000 in scholarships presented to 123 high school students. Ms. Regan thanked the many volunteers who helped to make Senior Week a great time for the seniors. STEM updates, Ms. Regan reminded the Committee that two students from the Ryan School, Brenden Howell and Evelyn Goldstein, made it into the National Invention Convention competing with another 300 inventors from across the country. Ms. Regan pointed out a couple of pictures in the packet of the Tewksbury Titans Robotics team competing in the WPI BattleCry 2022 event this past weekend. She offered congratulations to the team for winning one of the six judges awards, the Phantom Fighter.

### **Mr. Libby, Business Manager**

Mr. Libby reported that the Business Office is putting out bids to resurface a classroom wing at the Wynn Middle School. They have also put out-to-bid to expand the Dewing Office, to bring back the nurses suite back to the main office and to include security updates. He reported that they had an audit on the copier usage in the district and the recommendation was to reorganize resources back into schools and move away from a centralized copy center. This would be a major change, we are going to research and explore the recommendation during the 2022-2023 school year. He reported that annually the district reports to the state on every dollar spent and earned. A firm conducts an end-of-year audit on the report. He was happy to say we received the results of the end-of-year audit reporting that there were no findings. Mr. Libby addressed Mr. Sullivan, informing him that he is still working on his request for information relative to the public record requests; he will report on his findings at the July meeting.

## **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

### **Elementary School Building Committee**

Mr. Sullivan reported that the new elementary school project is on time and on budget. The Center School has been taken down. He reported that the Elementary School Building Committee will be meeting tomorrow night, June 9th, at 6:00 P.M.

### **Tewksbury SEPAC**

Ms. Biagioni-Smith reported that she attended the May 19th SEPAC reorganization meeting. She added that they have PAL spots open if anyone would like to be a school liaison for the SEPAC. She reported that the SEPAC's final business meeting will be held on May 16th.

### **Wellness Advisory Committee**

Mr. Russo announced that the Wellness Advisory Committee rescheduled the June 1st meeting to June 15th.

### **Policy Sub-Committee**

Mr. Sullivan reported that the Policy Sub-committee is comprised of Ms. Garabedian, Ms. Theriault-Regan and himself. The Policy Sub-Committee meetings are open meetings, they are open to the public but not for public participation. Comments may be submitted to any one of the members of the Sub-Committee. He reported that the Policy Sub-Committee has begun a review of the policy manual as many of the policies have not been reviewed since 2013. He added that the Massachusetts Association of School Committees does our policy recommendations and there will be many policies reviewed that will not require updates.

## **POLICY CHANGES, PROPOSALS, AND ADOPTIONS**

Ms. Garabedian hoped the Committee had an opportunity to review the policies and asked if the Committee members had any questions or comments regarding the suggested updates to the following policies.

Policy BEDH, Public Comments: Mr. Russo commented that who can attend the meetings should be clarified in the policy. He also would like the length of time on the agenda to be reflected in the policy. Ms. Biagioni-Smith inquired if there is a time limit to sign-in. There were no further comments.

Mr. Sullivan presented some insight into the revisions to the following policies. He reported that the Sub-Committee is reviewing policy BJ, School Committee Legislative Program, as he is not aware of the School Committee appointing a member to the Legislative Program and commented that Tewksbury has bipartisan politics.

He reported that proposed revisions to policy EFD, Meal Charge Policy, are relative to delinquent accounts policy BEDH-E is an exhibit not a policy and has conflicting information.

**2022 Summer School Update**

Superintendent Regan reported that the School Committee received the Summer School grid opportunities in the packet; the information has been shared with families and posted on the website. She announced that the availability for acceleration grant dollars for Summer School programs is now available. She will provide an update at the July School Committee meeting.

**NEW BUSINESS**

**TMHS Travel Opportunities for 2022-2023 SY and 2023-2024 SY**

Bailey Mahoney addressed the School Committee reporting that the high school is ready to travel. They are proposing several international opportunities for TMHS students and allowing families a longer time to make smaller payments to help more kids have the opportunity to participate. We will be able to save money by planning and booking early.

At the recommendation of the Superintendent, Mr. Sullivan moved, seconded by Ms. Biagioni-Smith, to allow for the high school the opportunity for planning and funding for the TMHS travel opportunities for the 2022-2023 and the 2023-2024 school years, pending final approval of the School Committee with all necessary documentation. All Aye. Unanimous Vote. Motion carried 5-0.

Ms. Regan reported that the 2022 Summer Reading Program information is in the Committee packet and posted on the district website. She commented that the Wynn School had great success with the one-school-one-book assignment last year, that they will do it again. We have partnered with the Tewksbury Public Library, they will have books available, and they are also offering several reading opportunities over the summer for kids.

### **Appointment to the Tewksbury Diversity, Equity & Inclusion Advisory Committee (TDEIAC)**

Ms. Garabedian reported that the School Committee needs to re-appoint a member to the TDEIAC, a Sub-Committee of the Select Board. Mr. Parsons stated that he would be interested to serve on the TDEIAC for another term.

Mr. Sullivan motioned for the School Committee to appoint Mr. Parsons to serve as the School Committee's designee on the Tewksbury Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Advisory Committee for the 2022-2023 school year, seconded by Mr. Russo.

All Aye. Unanimous Vote. Motion carried. 5-0.

### **Vote on Superintendent Contract**

Ms. Garabedian opened for comments and/or questions from the School Committee members regarding the contract for Superintendent Brenda Regan.

Mr. Russo moved to approve the contract between the Tewksbury School Committee and Brenda Regan, seconded by Mr. Sullivan.

Roll Call Vote - Voting Yes: Mr. Parsons, Mr. Sullivan, Ms. Biagioni-Smith, Mr. Russo, and Ms. Garabedian. All Aye. Unanimous vote. Motion carried 5-0.

Superintendent Regan added an informational item to the Superintendent's Report, reporting that earlier tonight the district successfully ratified and signed off on the last of the Collective Bargaining Agreements for the Tewksbury Administrators Group (TAG) and the Food Services. She reported that all seven (7) contracts have been completed.

### **SCHOOL COMMITTEE MATTERS OF INTEREST**

Mr. Sullivan gave a *Shout-out!* to Ron Drouin, the Best Buddies, Brian Aylward, and all the staff and students that participate in the 2nd Annual TPS Special Olympics day. He offered congratulations to the Class of 2022 seniors and families and hopes they enjoy the rest of Senior Week. Ms. Biagioni-Smith reported on several events and wished everyone a happy Pride Month. She gave a *Shout-out!* to all that helped with and supported the Dewing and North Street Fun Run; on the last day of school there will be an ice cream social/playground event from 12:30-2:30 with the assistance and support of Officer Welch, Tewksbury Police Department, the school PACS, and the Tewksbury Fire Department; the Ryan School hosted the Science Wizard event; she attended the Ryan Choir rehearsal; 4th grade's had a Luau at the Trahan School last week; the Heath Brook held a field day yesterday; the Trahan and North Street held field days as well; and there will be free tennis lessons offered in July. Mr. Russo gave a *Shout-out!* congratulating the 2022 graduating seniors and recognizing them for the many scholarships they received and he thanked the community for supporting the scholarship program.

Ms. Garabedian thanked Superintendent Regan for the shared spreadsheet with the School Committee of the end-of-year school events and she thanked the administration and staff for letting them attend the events. She asked the School Committee members to start thinking about the superintendent's review. She announced that the MASC/MASS conference will be held in November asking the Committee members to let her know if they would like to attend. Ms. Garabedian recognized Mr. Bernard for his time in Tewksbury.

She also commented that the Wynn PAC recognized the Board of Health for supporting their Food Truck event. Mr. Sullivan wished the Redmen Girls' the best of luck as they chase the Girls Softball Championship win.
