# Standards Based Learning







## What is the purpose of a Standards Based Report Card?

The purpose of a standards based report card is to communicate **clearly** and **objectively** how a student is progressing toward mastering the grade level state standards set forth by the Department of Elementary and Secondary education (DESE). In this way, students are measured against a consistent set of academic criteria.






# Where do standards come from?









Our current report card is not aligned with the Massachusetts State Standards or the TPS curriculum. Our current report card does not allow teachers to be specific about what students know and are able to do or what students still need to work on to meet grade level expectations.

The standards based report card we have developed will allow us to report individual student progress toward state standards and habits of character.





#### Traditional Grading

#### Standards Based Grading

- Teacher determines what is graded
- Different tasks are given different weights
- Grades are averaged
- Teachers may include class participation, homework, effort, conduct

- All students are measured against the same set of standards
- All tasks are designed to demonstrate progress toward mastery of the standard
- Mastery of standards
- Student's grade reflects only progress toward a specific standard



#### File: JLC-R-2 - PROCEDURES FOR PEDICULOSIS (HEAD LICE)

- 1. Students will be periodically checked for head lice throughout the school year and also when reported by school faculty and/or a parent/guardian.
- 2. If a student is found to have head lice the student will be removed from the classroom and the parent/guardian will be notified. The nurse will send a letter to the parents/guardians of the class where head lice was identified.
- 3. At the time of dismissal the nurse will review the treatment protocol with the parent/guardian. The parent/guardian will also be informed that they or a designated adult must bring the student to the school nurse for re-screening once the student has been treated.
- 4. If no lice are found, the student may re-enter class. If lice are seen, the student is sent home for further care.


