Notes from Tewksbury Memorial High School

Rania Elouahi, Student Council Representative, presented the Notes from Tewksbury Memorial High School. Rania's final student report of the year:

- The Girls Softball team are still playing in the state Semifinals;
- A Fall sports meeting was held on Monday, June 12th;
- The Senior Prom and Promenade and was held on June 6th;
- Senior Week was held last week with graduation on June 9th;
- On June 6th & 7th the Freshmen took the final MCAS of the year (Biology);
- AP classes have had their final meetings and student contracts are due by the end of the year;
- Classes for next year have been solidified and the Guidance Department is taking care of course issues;
- Gold Cards, for exemption of finals, were given out over the past few weeks;
- This is the last week of school; finals are scheduled on Thursday.

Zoo Project - Ryan Elementary School STEM

Ms. Regan introduced the Ryan School STEM teachers, Ms. Lindsey and Ms. Hillson. Principal McInnes invited the students to introduce themselves and each gave the School Committee information on their project. The STEM Zoo Project was a year-long project in which the students redesigned habitats for animals to meet their needs. Principal McInnes announced that the whole school was involved in making the presentation happen. The students responded to questions and comments from the School Committee.

Tewksbury SEPAC End-of-Year Recap

Ms. Mancini addressed the Committee and presented an overview of the role and responsibility of the SEPAC and presented the highlights of the 2022-2023 school year. TPS STEM & IT Updates

Jason Stamp, Director of IT & STEM, presented an update on the security audit relating that progress has been made on the Data Privacy Audit. He reported that our Tech coaches send out a weekly Tuesday Tech Tips to help teachers keep up-to-date on cyber security updates.

He presented an update on the math instruction, the progress the district has been making over the past two years and the next steps. Mr. Stamp responded to questions and comments from the School Committee.

She gave an overview of the general purpose, a comparison of the present report card and the standard-based report card, and how to report grades. She shared a video from the MA Department of Elementary & Secondary Education on Standard Based Learning. Ms. McDermott responded to questions and comments from the School Committee members.

SUPERINTENDENT & STAFF REPORTS

Superintendent's Report

Ms. Regan wished everyone a happy Flag Day. She presented the Superintendent updates reporting that UMASS Lowell is once again offering the Engineering Camp program. She pointed out that a copy of the TMHS 88th Commencement Ceremony for the Class of 2023 is in the Consent agenda. Another item on Consent is the Appendix B Athletic recommendations. The recommendation for the Appendix B Co-Curricular activities will be in the July packet. The TMHS Girls Softball team made it to the Division 2 State Semifinals scheduled tonight; due to the weather the game was postponed to tomorrow night. Students between the ages of 14-17 may get working papers at the district office. As a reminder, Ms. Regan announced that Friday is the last day of school and will be an early release day. Ms. Regan notified the Committee that the Ryan School has made an update to their 23/24 Student Handbook.

Due to a thunderstorm during the meeting, the School Committee meeting *live feed* was lost at 8:10 p.m. The meeting continued to be recorded.

Assistant Superintendent's Report

Ms. McDermott reported that she attended her first Probability Carnival relating that kids created carnival games for students at the Center School and created the probability of students winning. She gave a *Shout-out!* to all those involved. She reported that over 100 teachers were interested in participating in the summer curriculum work. The summer curriculum will prioritize dual enrollment and the MSNT playbook; she will give an update at the July School Committee meeting.

Ms. McDermott reported that the final report cards will be posted on Aspen on the last day of school; parents may reach out to the school secretary if they have any difficulty opening the report card. She gave a friendly reminder for everyone to do their summer reading stating that parents may also read to or listen to their children read. Ms. McDermott responded to questions and comments from the School Committee members.

Business Manager's Report

Mr. Libby reported that the Business Office is busy closing the FY23 fiscal year book and opening the FY24 book. We are keeping an eye on grants with expiring dates coming up and the TTA members have received their salary statement. In the Transportation Department, we continue to develop models for next year. If any schedule changes are made, he will report the information to the Committee. We are trying a method to identify who the riders will be and are considering a registration process. Mr. Libby reported that he met with an engineering firm regarding the heating and cooling systems at the Heath Brook and Dewing Schools. They will have a design and bid specifications out in early fall to be completed next summer. Mr. Libby responded to questions and comments from the School Committee members.

Ms. Garabedian reported that MCAS does not have policy JLC-R-2 in the sample policy manual and based on the fact that it is not a communicable disease any longer she recommends that the School Committee move to rescind JLC-R-2.

Mr. Russo moved, seconded by Mr. Parsons, to rescind policy JLC-R-2 on a first and final reading. Roll Call Vote: Voting Yes: Mr. Parson, Mr. Russo, Ms. Biagioni-Smith, Ms. Anderson and Ms. Garabedian. Unanimous vote. Motion carried 5-0.

Ms. Garabedian reported that the following policy has been reviewed and revised and is presented on the Informational Reading: CM, School District Annual Report. No vote is required at this time.

OLD BUSINESS

Enrollment as of June 1, 2023

Ms. Regan provided an enrollment update relating that enrollment has increased by 30 since the October 1st Count. She reported that next year the high school enrollment will be approximately 711, relating that each year we lose about 100 students from 8th to 9th grade. Ms. Regan responded to questions and comments from the School Committee members.

TPS Summer School & Enrichment Grid

Ms. Regan reported on the summer programming enrichment opportunities relating that due to an increase in demand for AlphaBEST, the district has opened additional schools for their use. She reported that the district received \$75,000 from the AESOP grant for after school programming. Mr. Russo commented that the School Committee is tasked to approve grants asking if the grants will be on the Consent Agenda. Mr. Libby responded that once the Competitive Grants are approved it will be brought to the Committee. Ms. Regan responded to questions and comments from the Committee members.

The School Committee members commented on the great end of year events at the schools. Ms. Anderson gave a brief update on the DEIAC committee relating that they hosted a Pride Lights celebration on June 1st.

Mr. Russo responded that the Appendix B Committee has been reviewing the Appendix B and will report once completed.
