





District Overview of Performance English Language Arts




School Performance- English Language Arts




District Overview of Performance Mathematics

District Overview of Performance Science




School Level Performance - Science





DELAYED OPENING (2-HOUR DELAY)

In order to conserve the use of "NO SCHOOL" days, we have developed an alternate plan to delay the start of school by 2 hours on mornings when it appears weather conditions will improve. Under this plan, the following schedule will be followed:

All schools will be dismissed at their regular times.

Delayed Openings will be announced on television stations normally used for "NO SCHOOL" announcements, posted on the district website, *Twitter* @tpsdistrict (AKA "X"), and on One Call Now, our telephone notification system.

SCHOOL CANCELLATION

The decision to cancel school will be made after all weather and road conditions have been evaluated on the basis of the information available at the time. **Parents should use their discretion regarding sending their children to school on inclement weather days.** "NO SCHOOL" announcements will be broadcasted on television stations (Channels 4, 5, 7, 25 and NECN), on One Call Now, our telephone notification system, and *Twitter @tpsdistrict*. (AKA "X")

EARLY DISMISSAL: Early dismissals due to unforeseen conditions are highly unusual.

In the event we must dismiss schools early due to inclement weather or other conditions, an announcement will be made on television stations normally used for "NO SCHOOL" announcements, posted on the district website, *Twitter @tpsdistrict*, and on One Call Now, our telephone notification system. System-wide early dismissal will be in the following order: High School, Wynn, Ryan, Center, Heath Brook and Dewing Schools. Hopefully, we can avoid some school cancellations during the winter by use of this plan. Your cooperation is appreciated.

INCLEMENT WEATHER RELEASE

It is HIGHLY UNLIKELY that Tewksbury Public Schools will execute an unplanned early dismissal due to weather conditions. However, on occasion, if unexpected weather and/or traffic conditions warrant, we may execute an **Inclement Weather Release**. Under an **Inclement Weather Release**, the two earliest releasing schools, Tewksbury Memorial High School and John Wynn Middle School will be released 20 minutes early. Subsequently, the Ryan School and Center School would release 10 minutes early. The purpose of this plan is to allow school buses and vans more time to complete their drop off routes (under these slower conditions) and arrive at their next school(s) on time for dismissal.

Under an Inclement Weather Release the schools would follow this dismissal schedule:

TMHS - 1:30 (normally 1:50) Wynn Middle - 1:30 (normally 1:50) Ryan School - 2:20 (normally 2:30) Center School - 2:20 (normally 2:30)

Note, there would be no change in dismissal time at the Dewing School and the Heath Brook School.

ONE CALL NOW ALERT

Our emergency alert system will notify parents of school closures, cancellations, early dismissals or delays. A telephone call will be initiated to individual homes generally at 5:45 a.m. Calls to the entire District are usually completed within 45 minutes. Families who have opted IN for One Call Now text messages will also receive a text notification of school closures, cancellations, early dismissals or delays.

Dear Parents, Guardians, and 8th Grade Students,

At this time of year, students and parents and guardians begin to think about what their high school experience will look like. Given Tewksbury's location in the Merrimack Valley, the surrounding educational options are plentiful and encompass a wide range of programs and curriculum offerings.

Tewksbury Memorial High School provides an educational experience that prepares students for college and career with course offerings that are both diverse and challenging. Some highlights are below.

- Thirteen (13) Dual Enrollment classes offered through either Southern New Hampshire University(SNHU) or Middlesex Community College(MCC). We continue to seek additional course offerings for our students.
- Sixteen (16) Advanced Placement classes, far exceeding the number of offerings at many private schools.
- Twenty-three (23) Honors classes available for students in-person at TMHS or through online learning opportunities.
- Engineering Innovation Pathway in partnership with UMASS Lowell. This includes advanced courses from Project Lead the Way (PLTW), focusing on team-based problem solving to prepare students for technical and project management careers. This program aims to equip students with the knowledge, skills, and experiences necessary to pursue a successful career in Engineering.
- Senior Project, which provides all seniors an opportunity to explore a career interest or passion through an internship for an intensive 8-week period of time culminating in an exhibition.
- Professional Career Pathway Planning, a collaborative effort between students and counselors to explore and identify career interest and determine the appropriate coursework.
- Graduating seniors attend the same universities and military academies as graduates from prestigious private schools. In fact, 86% of our 2024 graduates attend either a four-year or two-year college or university.
- Seal of Biliteracy is a designation that a student receives upon demonstrating proficiency in two or more languages.

I know you will consider TMHS as the best option for your child's secondary education experience.

Students in Tewksbury have the option to apply for admission at Shawsheen Valley Technical High School. This option provides students the educational experience of shops with academic classes. Shawsheen Valley Technical High School is a valued educational partner and offers an array of programs to meet the needs of Tewksbury students.

Please note, the School Committee has enacted guidelines that limit the School District's liability for cost associated with enrollment in other technical high schools. The guidelines read as follows:

Career, Vocational and Technical School Application Process

Chapter 74 Non-Resident Tuition

Students interested in out-of-district placements under Chapter 74 Vocational education for an upcoming school year <u>must</u> submit their application to Tewksbury Public Schools, Superintendent Brenda Theriault-Regan, for the specific school they wish to attend by April 1st of the preceding school year. Tewksbury Public Schools reserves the right to reject any application received after that date.

If you are considering applying to Minuteman Career & Technical High School, Greater Lowell Technical High School, Whittier Regional Vocational Technical High School, or other neighboring technical schools, you need to submit a <u>Chapter 74 Vocational Technical Education Non-Resident Tuition Application</u> to my office as part of the application process. This document can be obtained from the Guidance Office at each of the technical high schools. (This does not apply to Shawsheen Valley Technical High School.) The deadline for submitting an application is April 1 of the preceding school year.

Tewksbury Memorial High School has a proud reputation within the community and offers expansive and comprehensive educational and extracurricular programs that will challenge and excite all students regardless of their strengths and interests. There are great things happening in classrooms, on athletic fields, and everywhere TMHS students gather.

This fourth-quarter, off-campus experience provides eligible seniors with an opportunity to apply 21st century skills in real-world settings. Students may pursue externships with businesses or professional organizations, participate in a community service project, or complete a research paper or project.

Early College Courses (EC) (also referred to as Dual Enrollment)
TMHS has partnered with Middlesex Community College and Southern
New Hampshire University to provide students with opportunities to take
college-credit bearing courses while completing their requirements for
high school graduation. DE courses are weighted the same as Advanced
Placement coursework. Current course offerings include Accounting,
Applied Marketing, Anatomy & Physiology, Biology, Calculus, International
Relations, Introduction to Drawing, Senior English, Statistics, and US
History.

Innovation Pathways Program

Innovation Pathways (IP) represent dynamic educational frameworks that guide students through specialized courses, which focus on fostering creativity, critical thinking, and problem solving skills. The IP program provides a curriculum that integrates academic knowledge with real-world applications. The IP program is designed to prepare students for both higher education and workforce readiness. In addition to MassCore academic requirements, students participate in two applied courses, two early college courses (DE/AP), and the Project Lead the Way Capstone course or an engineering-focused Senior Project.

Global Competency Certificate is a certificate TMHS students receive at graduation upon demonstrating their understanding and involvement within a global community. It is for students who feel passionately about improving and making a difference in the world. Through coursework, community service, and experiential learning students set themselves apart as global citizens that identify with the plight of others.


Loella F. Dewing Elementary School: Special Populations (Summer 2024) Communication (SAYO S) by Special Population






Loella F. Dewing Elementary School: Special Populations (Summer 2024) Critical Thinking (SAYO S) by Special Population



Please find attached Fiscal Year 2025 Budget documents for School Committee information and a Budget Transfer/Adjustment Request for your approval. The Town Budget was approved at Town Meeting on Monday, May 6, 2024. A supplemental budget request was made to the Town at Special Town Meeting on October 1, 2024 of \$386,895. As the school year has begun, the needs and available resources of the district have changed and I would like to adjust our budget to reflect these changes.

The enclosed transfer is attempting to re-allocate funds in the SALARY area of the budget. Salaries have been impacted by collective bargaining agreements being negotiated and finalized over the past several months. I will be addressing our Operating accounts at the December School Committee meeting, via an additional Budget Transfer.

Note that the bottom line School Budget figure has not changed. Our budget, inclusive of the additional funding from the town meeting in October is \$56,717,605.

I am enclosing account level budget documents with Actuals Year to Date by Location and Department for your information. These documents are reflective of the requested Budget Transfer and the detail is shown in the "TRANSFERS/ADJUSTMENTS" column.

Please let me know if I can provide any additional information for you in support of this request.
